### **Grapevine Art Project Announces Exciting Program Slate for 2018**

The Grapevine Art Project announces a variety of programs, exhibitions, and other activities for the 2018 year. The programs are open to everyone at no charge, and provide exciting, informative, and often inspirational looks at both artistic techniques and information necessary for operating a small business.

In January, noted woodworker Paul Benson gave a discussion and live demonstration of his intricate scroll-saw carving. He covered the whole process, from finding ideas through preparing the materials, to the painstaking hours of detailed carving. Recently Paul has expanded from woods to copper, and discussed that new avenue as well.

February brings a very complementary theme with Kandace Green, who will discuss and demonstrate the historic techniques used in block printing. The printing process results in quite unique pulls from the same block print, far more interesting than today's homogeneous technology.

Later in the quarter, Bruce Rosenstiel will hold several still photography workshops, ranging from a half-day to a full day, in which he will guide students through proper techniques and practices for capturing their works with photography. A widely published photographer, Rosenstiel brings decades of global experience into his popular workshops.
