The Miami Parking Authority fabricated emails to make it appear that they followed proper procedure for bidding at 240 N. Miami Ave, according to a Miami city attorney.

Mana's attorneys had said in a lawsuit that the MPA never provided proper notification of a decision to award the property to a rival. While the MPA had submitted emails as evidence of

notification, a forensic examination has now revealed the purported sent dates to be false, according to a city of Miami attorney.

MPA planning and development director Rolando Tapanes has resigned in the wake of the revelation, [according to the Herald](#). MPA CEO Art Noriega, [rumored to be a “Tampa homeboy”](#) of the winning bidder, remains in his position.
