Title: TRACKS Oshkwazin Indigenous Youth Leadership Program – Summer 2020 Youth Ambassador Work term: 30 hours/week for 8 weeks between July and August Wage: \$14/hour Reporting to: Oshkwazin Coordinator Number of positions: 4

Oshkwazin is an Indigenous youth leadership program nested within the TRACKS Youth Program based at Trent University in Nogojiwanong (Peterborough, Ontario). Oshkwazin offers meaningful training and leadership development opportunities, as well as mentorship, training, team-building, and cultural learning experiences for high-school-aged Indigenous youth.Inspired by the mandate of IESS program, TRACKS Oshkwazin aims to empower Indigenous youth to utilize their traditional ecological knowledge (TEK).

We are seeking 4 full-time staff members to support TRACKS Oshkwazin Indigenous Youth Leadership Program throughout the Summer. Please note that the availability of this position is conditional on funding.

Key Responsibilities

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- Develop and maintain a learning portfolio to be evaluated at the end of the Summer
- Participate in training and workshops relating to the Oshkwazin Youth Ambassador curriculum
 - Maintain regular work hours in communication with Oshkwazin Coordinator
 - weeknights and weekends are sometimes required
- Responsible for one a one-week social media takeover during the summer
- Create bi-weekly blog posts or blog post contributions
- Participate in brainstorm sessions relating to Oshkwazin Program brand and website re-development
- Participate in the design of leadership program curriculum including researching, developing, and testing activities
- Represent TRACKS Oshkwazin at various outreach or community events including Powwows
- Contribute to the future of the program by participating in evaluation, providing feedback and sharing perspective on a regular basis
- Assist Outreach & Education staff in facilitation of workshops and Summer camps
- Assist Outreach & Education staff with ongoing development of workshops and Summer programs
- Other duties as assigned by Oshkwazin Coordinator

Required Skills and Qualifications

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• Must be interested in Indigenous cultural Knowledge

Prior experience is not necessary, an interest in learning is much more important!

- Basic computer skills such as word processing and email communication
- Ability to take direction and work independently
- Strong teamwork and willingness to collaborate with others
- Reliable and respectful communication towards coworkers and supervisors
- Excellent people skills and a friendly attitude
- Must be willing to work a flexible schedule, with some evening and weekend hours

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(including First Nation, Metis, Inuit and non-status), those identifying as two-spirit or LGBTQ, parents and caregivers, and those dealing with adversity in their lives. Due to the funding structure of TRACKS Oshkwazin, and the goal of the program being to nurture Indigenous leaders, only Indigenous applicants will be considered for these positions.

- Experience working or volunteering with summer camps and/or youth programs
- Traditional Ecological Knowledge that pertains to beading, quillwork, weaving, hunting, fishing, harvesting, plant identification, dancing etc., are highly valued
- Prior knowledge and interest in personal Indigenous cultural history
- First aid training
- Lifeguard certification
