

A demonstration by **Robert Till** at Walsgrave Baptist Church on Saturday 9th February 2019.

Report by Graham Ball

The first demonstration of the year for Coombe Abbey Woodturners was by Robert Till. We had met Robert once before when he filled in for Steve Heeley at Bulkington when Steve was suffering with an illness. I have received lots of photos and diagrams from John

Martin-Law and Giles Headley so I will let these pictures do the talking instead of a blow by blow narrative of the days proceedings.

On this occasion being a full days demonstration Robert decided to start by turning a acorn shaped "Bird Feeder". As the pictures will show this would entail turning a two part piece which involved spindle work and hollowing. Also there was some hand work involved in cutting out the opening for the seed to be tipped in easily.



Having turned the piece Robert now parts off the lid



After hollowing the base portion, Robert now cuts the seed fill opening with a jig saw.




In these three pictures top left and clockwise is the process for the ebonising and gilding. It can be seen in the picture on the right how important it is to make sure there are no tooling marks evident which will show up on the finished piece. The next piece was similar in shape but colouring techniques were demonstrated.



Pyrography at Coombe Abbey Workshop

For the sessions to run


Activities in the Workshop

Husband Matt was being guided by Lionel Crabbe and they were undertaking a slightly more ambitious piece, a Goblet with a stem involving spindle work, again as to be expected the piece was of good form and proportion. the test for many new turner was in the hollowing and the required tool control "finding the bevel" along with a sharp gouge but this will come in time and with a little bit of practice and a bit more practice. 

Woodturning Weekender


