Introduction

Following from the AGM where Marlene gave notice of giving up her role as secretary from next year and prompted by a member asking if there was a job description for the role of secretary the following role descriptions have been drafted



The aim is to formalise and document the roles Bob Packer club members already perform not to alter them in any way.

This article is the first of two (probably!) as this task is currently on-going that documents the various club roles. The role descriptions detailed below are intended provide a starting point from which they can be developed further to fully define the roles accurately. They also provide a form of check list of the duties for a given role.

Club Leadership Structure and Duties of Executive Officers

The club's leadership structure, ordinarily set out in its bylaws, is largely a matter of custom, preference, and practicality. The critical leadership positions are the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, and Treasurer. These roles form the executive committee which is responsible for producing a long-range plans and policies for the club and acts on behalf of the club between club general meetings. Listed below are the most common officers found typically clubs and their specific duties. It is proposed that the work of the Executive Committee will be supported by working groups (WG) formed by club volunteers where one of whom will act as liaison between the WG and the executive committee. Working group liaison officers will only be expected to attend committee meeting if they have matters to raise of if requested to do so by the executive

Well organised and happy to delegate

Responsibilities

Provides leadership and direction to the club organization

Understands and adheres to the Club rules and by-laws

Liaises with the AWGB

Presides at meetings of the club and oversees the activities of the executive committee

Coordinates club activities through the executive committee and associated working groups

Establishes short and long-range objectives and goals in conjunction the executive committee and associated working groups

Structures the organisation of conjunction the executive committee and associated working groups to ensure the continued development of the club

Represents the club at meetings with external organisations

Promotes the club by planning activities in conjunction with the Coombe Park authorities and other organisations

Has overall financial responsibility for the club;

Approves all club communications;

Maintains regular contact with the visitor centre management regarding club activities and aspirations

Produces an annual report for the club's AGM.

When completing term as treasurer or stepping down before term is over: Helps transition new treasurer to office and makes sure all official records are transferred promptly.



While setting up we had an opportunity to view some of the exhibition pieces Stan brought along.











The morning was spent demonstrating how to turn a "thin lady", an offset piece on a base with a hat. The picture on the right shows four examples that Stan brought. Stan kindly donated one of these for the



kits for members to try their hand at making this interesting piece.

After lunch Stan set to work on making an open bind vessel, this is similar to a barley twist. I have tried to capture the stages of work in the following notes and pictures.

Pyrography at Coombe

Following on from requests by members Janine ran two pyrography beginners sessions at the workshop on Monday 18th March and Thursday 21st March

We concentrated on developing skills using varying heat settings, different speed of pen movements and using with or against grain of the wood to produce the different marks.

For those that attended they have now the chance to go away and practice some of the techniques discussed. If you didn't get chance to come along and would like a basic introduction to pyrography contact Janine and we'll organise another beginners session.

Coming up

A Demonstration by John Boyne-Aitken

Walsgrave Baptist Church 10am to 4pm approx. Saturday May 4th., 2019.



Using an Arbortec and wearing a full face visor (be very careful this process is dangerous) Stan cut two of open binds then drilled out more of the Centre until it was the required thickness and smoothed out.

This was sanded out.

Then Stan cut open the remaining binds wearing the full-face mask again for protection.

Stan then used the guide lines as the centre for each bind and cleaned up the binds using a Proxom long neck mini grinder (still taking great care and wearing full mask)



He then used a rasp or Dremil with flexible drive to smooth out edges of the bind.

Once smoothed all binds he sanded them and smoothed them until he had the required shape and smoothness.

To finish off he sanded using 120 grit and reducing this to get the smoother finish as required.

Stan shaped the bottom, being careful not to cut where the binds are and finally cut a bead and removed from the lathe.



And on the right are some pieces he made before today's demonstration.


