



A Little Bit of Down Under

Blackheart Sassafras, Tasmanian Sassafras Scientific Name: Atherosperma moschatum

Heartwood is naturally a grey to golden brown. Some trees are infected with a staining fungus which causes colourful



streaks and veins of dark brown and black, giving rise to the common name Blackheart

Sassafras. Sapwood is a pale yellow to whitish brown;

Banksia

Scientific Name: Banksia grandis
Banksia pods originate from southwestern Australia. They grow on trees from the Banksia genus. However, of the many Banksia species, typically only the pods from the Bull Banksia are large enough and solid enough to be used for woodturning applications.

Red Kangaroo

This story starts in 2004, on our first trip to Australia. We were flying into Perth via Singapore, firstly to catch up with relatives and then going on in a sort of figure of eight fashion around the Australian continent. One thing that country's like Australia and New Zealand take seriously is that

of bio-security. Packed in the centre of my rucksack for safekeeping were a couple of turned items as gifts for friends and relatives. Wood is one of those items they will not let you bring into the country until it has been checked for possible disease. So there we are at Perth Airport, standing in the immigration queue busily trying to delve through our clothes and other items to reach the offending articles. After a cursory glance, the immigration officer waved us through with the typical Ozzie response, "No worries."

Our relatives moved out to Australia in 1966 as "Ten pound Poms". Most of them are scattered around South Western Australia. On a walk in the bush (their term for countryside), we had our first encounter with the Banksia tree. Named after Joseph Banks, the naturalist who took part in Captain James Cook's voyage to Australia (1768-1771), there are many varieties of Banksia tree across the continent. The pods from these trees are often used for woodturning, but only those from the Bull or Giant Banksia are found suitable. Many pods were laying on the floor, but tempted as we may have been, we didn't collect any. It was only the start of our journey and we had many more thousands of miles to cover.

Upon flying into our next stop, Alice Springs, we were reminded again about Australia's compulsion with bio-security. We had crossed the state line from Western Australia to Northern Territory, and for many states you are not allowed to bring in certain foodstuffs, especially fruit! Fruit fly is considered most dangerous and can decimate the livelihood of many Australian farmers. Fortunately for us, there was a waste bin where we could dispose of our offending items before we were fined for attempting to bring in contraband. The Eastern states don't seem to be quite so hot on bio-security, but we have had quite intrusive checks at other state borders on later trips!

Following further stops along the Eastern coast, we arrived in Hobart, located in the South Eastern corner of Tasmania, to spend time with friends. One of our trips out from Hobart, was to the small town of Huonville and while there we visited the *Hounville Wood Museum*. Tasmania has quite a large forestry industry, and some fairly unique trees. The wood museum had a good a display of turned items, and also sold a nice range of turning blanks, so yours truly purchased a lump of Blackheart Sassafras. In Hobart, our friends Frank and Lynn introduced us to a great little shop that among other craft items, also did a nice range of



Returning via western Australia, gave us chance to collect a couple of Banksia pods before heading home via South Africa. Our supplies were safely packed in the centre of the rucksack. I imagine that the scan of our luggage as we passed through the different airports must have given the security operators a moment of head-scratching, but we were never challenged at any point along the way.

Back home, it took a further five years before I summoned up the courage to create something from my precious supplies. This was only in part from the fear of ruining a nice piece of wood that had come half way around the world with me, but also from the fact that soon after returning, my lathe was packed away, as we moved from a land based home to our floating home. On a trip out with the late Charlie Elliot to a woodturning show I purchased a mini lathe that would operate from our on-board generator, this gave me the opportunity to start turning again.

The attached pictures show a bowl made from beech the size being 155.mm x 55.mm with a decoration of a small raised area which has been textured with the Sorby rotary texturing



tool. This area was then ebonised and then a light cover of Gold



Framing wax applied to the surface of the texture.



The following pics are of a small bowl made out of a piece of beech which was donated by a neighbour, the bowl is a simple form being in side of 135 mm x 35 mm






Twist Drill Sharpening Using The Sorby ProEdge.

I don't know about anyone else but I have always struggled when it comes to sharpening metal twist drills. In the past I have had hit and miss results hand grinding and have acquired rather a lot of abused badly ground or blunt drills.

I tried a Picador jig but again had mixed results,



I was recently watching some youtube clips and found one that made a jig out of plywood for use with a grindstone and immediately wondered if it could be adapted for the Sorby.

Basically it was a piece of plywood with a 'V' grove cut in at 59 degrees. The normal point on a drill is 118 degrees (thus 118 divided by 2 = 59).

I noted the next platform setting up from 90 degrees on the ProEdge was 80 degrees Which would give a 10 degrees back clearance on the drill all I had to do was sort the 59 degrees. It is recommended to have between 9 and 12 degrees back Clearence.



I looked at bits of plywood like the youtube clip but then realised the solution was already there with a slight modification to the ProEdge standard gouge jig 'V' block.



What I did was take the standard gouge jig, 'V' block, and took out one of the slider retaining screws and carefully turned until I got the required 59 degrees



I now re-drilled and tapped the jig 4mm in the new position and secured it. (The block can easily be put back to standard as required)



It is not the precision tool room grind but with a little practice is very effective and very easy to use.



This is an example of a drill sharpened on the Sorby the larger drills are easier than the small drills but this is an eyesight problem rather than a problem with the setup. However I now have a box full of really sharp twist drills.

The modifications took less than 30 minutes and that included thinking time!





"Crude Oil Spill" by Graham Ball.

The Vessel is from a lovely piece of Ash given to me some years ago by John Bradbury. The base is Oak.
