




Stage 1: Regional assessments

Drivers illegal logging

- Poverty
- Commercial exploitation
- Failures of govts. and corruption
- Unclear controversial policies and legislation
- Weak institutional structures
- Inability to monitor

Consequences

- Environment: loss of biodiversity, deforestation, desertification
- Society and economy: revenue loss, corruption, crime, weakening of society fabric
- Cross border: tensions hindering sustainable development

Main Activities

- 1. SEE Regional Action Plan: focus on cross border aspects of illegal logging
- 2. Establishment of a informal network on illegal logging including environmental crimes aimed for better regional cooperation/ coordination
- 3. Capacity building: training and information exchange on environmental crime.

Illegal Logging and Environmental Crimes Network

- Coordination mechanism
- Regional platform for cooperation (SEE)
- Secretariat support
- Coherence with other instruments (WB, INECE)
- Focus on shared natural resource management and combating environmental crimes/ illegal logging

The illegal logging and environmental crimes network

- Members: national forest/ forest management authorities, police, customs (where relevant)
- Operations: training, networking, information exchange)
 - Further fundraising for the implementation
- Cooperation with partner organizations (e.g. INTERPOL, World Bank)
