By the time of our General Meeting we will be merged for almost 6 months. We are gradually becoming known in ASqD as an old/new club with our own unique signature. Ribbons & Souls hopefully will be known for our thoughtfulness, helpfulness, diligence, volunteering, enjoyment, friendliness and strong dancers.

CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL OF US on a job well done! We have managed to do something that very few clubs have accomplished in the past and do it extremely well! Our dances run smoothly, with good callers & cuers, classes are highly successful, the newsletter is interesting, attractive and full of important information, we have tasty goodies at classes & dances, with more than ample supplies. We are well represented at the ASqD and Federation meetings and visitations. We have attractive fliers to distribute, and advertise classes & dances in Open Squares, Blue Book, Grapevine, our Website and wheresthedance.com. Our executive board is functioning exceedingly well. We have new club fabric, badges, website and by laws. All of this is thanks to so very many of us.

Alan is now the R&S representative to the monthly meetings of the West Area Federation of Senior Citizens. Judy will assist Claire with the Installation Dinner at Tony P's, which is a lot of fun, has good food and has the added advantage of being a fund-raiser. We have a private room reserved for this occasion and will be sending out an inquiry so we can let them know approximately how many to prepare for. Thank you.

Volunteers are still needed for 2 positions that are vacated by our 90+ year olds who have each been doing their jobs for many years and are no longer able to continue due to their health. We need a volunteer to place the class & dance advertisements in the ongoing sections of Open Squares and Blue Book. Ruth Michaelson has completed them through 2019, which means we need to start inputting 2020 prior to September 1st. There is a template to follow in doing this, and she is willing to help if asked.

The other position that is most necessary and ASAP is that of Dance Kitchen Scheduling, which Evelyn Maggiore can no longer do, due to a severe health challenge. We currently have a schedule for dance refreshments and sign-ins at the check in table. However we do need a person to stay on top of this and make calls when a dance is not covered. Please contact Linda Harris or me if you are willing to volunteer for this very important and necessary position. You do not need to write an article in the newsletter, if you assume this position about the refreshments, that is optional.

Dance refreshments are the responsibility of all members who are able to do this. We have 28 dances a year, with 2 people per dance, which means a total of 56 places to sign up for refreshments. Our membership list is greater than the number of people that ever come to a dance, for many different reasons, including those who support the club but are too infirm to be present and those who are never able to be present on a weekend night. Thus each person will need to volunteer to do this twice a year, with a few possibly volunteering for three times. If you are concerned about money, there are a few people who have volunteered to assist with this and there is reimbursement for anyone who asks the treasurer for \$20 per dance, or \$10 per person. The newsletter always lists the person responsible for the dance, which is generally a president. We arrive by 6:15, and open the supply cupboard, so you can arrive early and have maximum time to dance.

Sadly, we said good-bye to Charlie Longobart for the last time this month. Fredi has a story about Charlie's Angels in this issue which promises to be heart warming.

Guys & Dolls have their 33rd Anniversary Dance coming up on Friday, May 17. Let's all appear in our new Ribbons & Souls outfits and welcome them back to Inglewood en masse. I look forward to a panorama of clothing in our wonderful fabric present at this event.



### **Charlie and His Angels**

You probably met Charlie Longobart when you first ventured into your first square dance class and he was an Angel in your square. You had to notice him despite his small physical stature because Charlie was really a big guy. You knew when you danced with him and everyone knew him. Charlie was a square dancer to the



bone. He believed in floor time, angeling classes, demonstrations and nursing home performances, board meetings, banner collections and storage, traveling and carpooling to dances, going to class level dances and after parties galore. When I meet him in 2005 Charlie was dancing a minimum of six days a week and on Sundays (when there wasn't a big dance to attend) he was a member of the after round dance party group that met in West Hollywood. Charlie loved the square dance system and danced and angeled at numerous clubs. He danced in Los Angeles, the South Bay, the San Fernando Valley, Simi Valley, Ventura, Indio, Bakersfield and other parts of the country. He wore super country western shirts and was always dressed as a dapper dancer.

And then there were Charlie's Angels. These were woman that Charlie took under his wing and decided to mentor into good dancers. He took us to other club classes, festivals and the advanced class to get another perspective on the dance and to make sure we had additional floor time. He would tell us about which festivals to attend and was always looking forward to going to the RIVCO Festival in Indio. Charlie was always ready to dance and his stylings were delightful. I could always rely on Charlie for a spin or extra twirl. We lost a great member of the square dance family when Charlie died. I lost my mentor and my friend.


