In relation to providing therapeutic intervention for people on the Self-differentiation (SD) and Self-presentation (SP) levels of creative ability, this workshop will enable participants to:

Learn the basics of how to play, explore and experiment with drums and percussion instruments Learn how to build soundscapes that prompt and enable social participation

Learn a number of exercises that can be facilitated in groups for people on the SD level, and groups for the SP level, explicitly linked to the VdTMoCA treatment principles and aims

Suitable for Occupational Therapists and OT support workers. Knowledge of the VdTMoCA levels of creative ability is desirable, but not essential.

Chris Baron was one of the first OT support workers to apply the VdTMoCA in mental health services in the UK, while working with Wendy Sherwood in 2008. Now a Music Therapist, Chris is joining with Wendy Sherwood to facilitate a fun, confidence-building workshop on using drums and percussion to benefit clients' health and well-being. Such activity is particularly effective for people on levels of Self-differentiation and Self-presentation.

Chris is well known for putting participants at their ease so that they can get the most from experiential handson courses, building confidence in own playing whilst developing skills and confidence to use drums and percussion with clients.

Dr Wendy Sherwood is an expert in the VdTMoCA and has used drumming & percussion with many clients, including using the principles of Ta-Ke-Ti-Na. Wendy will be teaching on how drumming & percussion exercises can be selected and graded through application of the VdTMoCA treatment principles in order to address specific therapy aims.
