<u>ST FAITHS PARISH CHURCH</u> <u>OF ST MARY AND ST ANDREW</u> The Church of England and the Methodist Church Worshipping & Working Together

It seems a long, long time since I wrote my previous letter for the journal, and who would have thought then that we would have faced the year we've experienced – and it isn't over yet! I hope that you have managed to find some measure of joy and relaxation over the last months. I do know, however, that for many people lockdown produced some really low moments and much sadness. I hear horrendous stories from friends all over the country, as well as in other countries, about their experiences, and I have to say, that in this relatively safe and quiet corner of our world, we have been extremely fortunate in so many ways.

It was hard for us, as a church community, not to be able to celebrate Easter together in church. It was really strange not being able to hold regular Sunday services in church or even meet together, but I continued to celebrate Holy Communion on my own, early each Sunday morning, and to remember everyone in prayer. It felt quite special and I am missing that now, in some ways – although it's lovely to be back in church together.

Church services, as we know them, are quite different now: we sit apart, observing social distancing rules, we are not permitted to sing yet, so the organ plays alone, we are wearing face coverings, we are sanitising our hands, we don't share the chalice (cup of wine) during Communion, and we cannot stand around chatting over a cup of coffee after the service, and so on. All of that is hard, but at least we can worship God together. Thankfully we were able to re-open our church at the beginning of August. We are currently only opening on Sunday mornings, to avoid taking advantage of those who willingly volunteer to clean the church. We would also have to provide stewards etc if the church were open at other times.

When the government told us we could re-open, the diocese advised that we only open one church in each grouping. Sadly, Spixworth has suffered ceiling damage, with falling plaster and more cracks appearing, so we are unable to meet there. (We are awaiting quotes for building works now!) Consequently, the church we opened was at St Faiths, and at a time somewhere between the two church schedules; so we are meeting at 10am each Sunday. So far, we have had about the right number of people attending (safely) and haven't had to turn anyone away. Obviously, we are coming into the season where we would expect to see more people (Remembrance, Advent & Christmas), so things might get difficult. As yet, we don't know what shape any of things might take. I do know that we won't be able to hold our usual Remembrance Sunday parade Service, or any Carol Services, but I am due to attend a couple of webinars over the next few weeks, so will know more after that. Please keep an eye on the church notice board and/or the village Facebook page and we will try to keep you up to date.

My guess at this time is, as long as we don't go into lockdown again, that Christmas Communion, at Midnight Christmas Eve and on Christmas Day, will need to be pre-booked, and if that means extra services, then so be it. I don't want to have to tell anyone they cannot come. The most important thing is that we continue to keep everyone as safe as we possibly can.

Please don't hesitate to get in touch if you have further questions or concerns and I will do my best to answer them. Obviously, things change almost daily, so nothing is guaranteed, but we will look forward to celebrating Christmas together somehow.

Meanwhile, look after yourself and each other.

Since the last edition of the Journal, the Government, the National Association of Local Councils and the Society of Local Council Clerks have all recommended that Parish Councils do not meet in public.

Consequently the Council decided to conduct any necessary business via Zoom.

There has only been one meeting since the March lockdown but as the situation looks set to continue the meetings will be held via Zoom on the normal evenings i.e. the third Monday at 7.30 p.m.

The annual accounts are currently with the auditors and will be published when they are returned. The Council decided to re-open the play areas at Newton and Horsham Parks but notices have been placed to warn users that these areas are unsupervised and without a cleaning regime so that they must observe government guidelines at all times.

The Council have commissioned a survey of all the street lights which, once completed, will enable them to consider conversion to up to date LED lanterns which will make a considerable saving on running costs and maintenance.



My last report in March announced that the Leagues were stopped owing to lock-down. Neither I nor the Team players have been able to play since, although limited practice sessions are beginning to happen. So far so good. but who knows what may happen tomorrow or next week.

I recently received our Norwich League strategy for the 2020/2021 season, if it is able to go forward.

I believe that the Dereham League and others are following the same policy

"Table Tennis England have defined a five stage process that should be followed to return to a position where league play and spectating can take place.

As we(Norwich League move towards August many of you will be wondering if the league will start as is currently planned in September. Thank you to all of you who have provided us information regarding your teams and venues through the Part 2 forms and the Team and Venue Initial Risk Assessments.

Summarising the information you sent us and also taking into account Government, Sport England and Table Tennis England guidance it is clear that:

- Some of the venues in our league will not be available for use in September
- The detailed guidance for both venues, leagues and players is still evolving and changing
- Clubs and venues will need time to develop and implement their own procedures which follow this guidance
- Some of our players are still not confident that it is yet safe to return to the table even to practice let alone to play competitive league games.

Taking all of the above into account, we have therefore made the decision that we will NOT be starting the NDTTL 2020-2021 season in September 2020 and our earliest PLANNED start date for league play is now January 2021."

So, I fear I have little to report for this journal. The Centre had been booked for our Norwich AGM in May, but of course that event was cancelled, together with our Presentation Night for silverware and awards. This is always a good social evening to meet up with old adversaries !

A "virtual" AGM was conducted in May, although I did not join in on "zoom", which I decided was a step too far. Little could be decided for the next season, and we need to wait and see how things progress towards an anticipated re-start next January.

I will keep you posted as the journals are resumed, and hope you are all coping as well as possible.



NEW HOUSING DEVELOPMENT IN NEWTON ST FAITH

The names of the roads chosen by the Parish Council for the new development in Newton St Faith have been based on historical facts and not randomly plucked out of the air!

In 1795 the mill at this site was owned by Stephen Ewing

By 1830 it was known as the Post Mill

In 1854 Stephen Ewing was listed as a miller and baker having built a bake office on his grocery shop He called this NEW TO ST FAITH This presumably led to our villages becoming known as

Horsham St Faith and Newton St Faith

The mill was used to grind barley for the bakery

Thus the new roads have been named

Crown Meadow Way in keeping with Crown Garage

Post Mill Close after the mill originally on this site

Barley Close after the bakery originally on this site



In view of the fact that these courts are not being used and the cost of keeping them moss-free is excessive the Management Committee have decided that at some time in the future another use needs to be found.



Mandy's year of Sheepy Fundraising ~ Completed.

On 12th January I set off from Edale in Derbyshire with 146 other runners attempting to complete the toughest footrace in the UK and one of the hardest in the world.

The Spine Race is a 268-mile winterrun/hike along the entire length of the Pennine Way. By the time I finished,158 hours later, I had covered 315 miles due to navigational errors and the brutal nature of the terrain which meant we were constantly weaving our way around bogs and rocks.

It was a race unlike any other I had ever taken part in. Carrying mandatory survival equipment including a sleeping bag, bivi bag, camping stove, 3,000 calories of food, water, maps, headtorches and additional clothing etc made for a heavy backpack. We had to make our way over mountains, fells, moors & bogs, by the side of riverbeds, along flagstone paths, Hadrians Wall and through forests.

The weather threw everything at us and I experienced heavy rain, gales including the full force of Storm Brendan, snow and 90 mile an hour winds on the summit of Cross Fell which blew me right over continuously so that I had to crawl and roll my way along the snowy top ridge of the mountain. After about 120 miles I had swollen ankles, blisters and tendonitis. I also had heavy nose bleeds, hallucinations and was sleep deprived.

I never once considered giving up though although there were times when I wondered if the race would beat me. On several occasions I fell waist deep into freezing bogs and I had to be dragged out of one on the Cheviot Hills by a fellow competitor. It was the most wonderful, exhilarating and incredibly tough outdoor experience I have ever had. The support from the Spine Race organisers, the medics & Mountain Rescue team was second to none.

There was also incredible comradeship amongst us racers as we encouraged each other along and looked after fellow racers who were in difficulty.

Arriving in Kirk Yetholm in Scotland was a moment I will never forget, I was filmed finishing and the icing on the cake was hearing my son Jamie's voice encouraging me in. I had no idea Jamie would be there along with good friend Andy Bailey from the Sheep Sanctuary who drove all the way to Scotland to look after me and drive me safely back home.

Out of 146 starters only 63 of us completed the Spine Race. I was immensely grateful to be one of the 63 and will treasure the memories and experience for ever.

The most wonderful part of all of this though is that an incredible £4,194 has been raised for the Mirkwood Rest Home for Retired Sheep, the sheep sanctuary and good cause I have been supporting with all my challenges.

My other challenges included running the Manchester marathon in 3 hours and 56 minutes, completing the London Marathon dressed as a sheep, 1st lady at the Thames Ring 250 mile trail race, completing Snowdon Mountain Ultra, Lakes in a Day Ultra and finally the Spine Race.

I would like to say a huge THANK YOU to everyone who has supported and sponsored me. Andy Bailey who voluntarily runs the sanctuary has been incredibly grateful and it has been the nicest fundraising experience ever. I will continue to support the Mirkwood Rest Home for Retired Sheep in other ways and will always be happy to pass on any further donations to Andy.


