 Presentation by Bill Aldridge, Wigan Archaeological Society - Roman Wigan, Coccium

Bill gave a very enthusiastic and knowledgeable presentation, where he outlined in great detail the findings of the latest evidence of a large Roman settlement in Wigan which appears to be much more important and extensive than was once previously thought.

There is evidence of a substantial Roman bathhouse, and also possible barrack houses on the site.

Lost Roman roads, whose existence had been documented by earlier antiquarians, but with the exact locations lost over time, are now being discovered through excavations by the Wigan Archaeological Society, who have unearthed sections of the Roman Road in the Beech Hill area leading North to Standish and onwards towards Bamber Bridge.

He also talked about Roman coins and other findings in the Wigan area. The Chair thanked Bill for his most interesting talk on behalf of the group.

As the presentation lasted for a considerable length of time it was then decided to rush ahead with the members meeting, and as the Secretary was dealing with the payment for the speaker during the first part of the meeting, the minutes are in less detail than usual.
