What I particularly liked about the book is that the authors finish each chapter with a do-able in the final Intercultural Reality Check. The key to mindfulness and flexible intercultural communication for me is to recognize with gratitude the possibilities of friendship with people who are different from me. I hope that the security and hospitality that I offer will be returned to me so that my life will be enriched and that my training continues. ... a more inspiring, useful guide to improving communication between different cultures and languages.
