Source: Getty Images Transferring a smartphone or tablet to a child is a good way to distract them, but when they shop in-app on a device, it can be an expensive distraction. Four law firms filed a class action on behalf of Android users against Google (NASDAQ:GOOG) for doing little to prevent these purchases. The lawsuit was filed in U.S. District Court for the District of Northern California, not far from where Google's headquarters are located. The lead plaintiff in the case is a New York mother whose sons purchased the currency from the app after she downloaded Marvel Run Jump Smash! on her Samsung Galaxy tablet last month. The total cost of one or both of her sons was almost \$66, none of which was made with her permission. As it happened that Google Play downloads apps are password-linked whether the new app is free or paid downloads. Within half an hour of receiving the initial password resolution, the user can download or purchase additional content without a password. Google Play accounts require Google Wallet to have some form of credit or debit card attached to complete registration. Only then can the user download any content, paid or free. The lawsuit alleges that Google knew about this permission window and did nothing to stop it. In fact, court toppings say that apps and other content encouraged such purchases. These games are very addictive, designed intentionally so, and tend to get kids playing them to buy a large amount of gaming currency, worth up to \$100 per purchase or more. Thus, the sale of gaming currency to minors is very profitable, the complaint says. Many of the highest-grossing apps in Google Play are so-called freemium apps that can be downloaded for free, but users are encouraged to pay for additional content. The very popular and highest-grossing game application Candy Crush Saga is a prime example. Since the most downloaded apps are games, this additional content comes in the form of additional levels or in-game boosts such as currency. Unintentional purchases of children on their parents' smartphones or tablets are relatively common. A January New York Times article stated that Apple (NASDAQ:AAPL) would refund any such purchases made by minors on their devices. According to the report, Apple received about 37,000 claims. A quick internet search showed pages of articles and blogs advising parents on how to get refunds for their children's purchases made or how to disable in-app purchases entirely to prevent such unintentional purchases. The class action was filed about a year after Apple settled a Federal Trade Commission lawsuit in 2011 about an almost identical situation. Apple's window without a password was fifteen minutes ago, but after settling, each or buying from the App Store requires a password, even if they are only minutes apart. Apple settled the case by about \$5 million and paid another \$32.5 million in fines earlier this year. How you turn on the dark Android mode depends on which version of Android your smartphone or tablet works. The instructions in this article apply to Android 10 and Android 9 (Pie). Dark mode is not available in older versions of the operating system. By default, the theme shade is set in the same wallpaper detection mode based on automatic mode as the older Android versions, but now there are dedicated options for a permanent color theme. To turn on the dark theme on Android 10 devices: Open the Settings app. Tap the display. Tap the switch switch next to a dark theme to turn it on. From there, swipe down from the top of the screen to get to the quick settings. You will see a new and dark gray background with white text. Some apps, such as Google Chrome, Google Pay and YouTube, also automatically adapt to the dark theme. Android 9.0 (Pie) has added an option to switch between dark and light themes, but the process is slightly different from Android 10. To turn on dark mode on Android 9: Start the Settings app and tap the Display. Click Advanced to expand the list of options. Scroll down and tap the device's theme, then tap Dark in a pop-up conversation box. On Android 9, settings menus and other interface elements, such as notifications that pop up below quick settings, remain toned for a light theme consisting of white background and black text. However, if you know how to change android wallpaper, you can pair a darker mode with lighter wallpapers for a more consistent experience. Users can also complement the dark interface by customizing individual apps into their dark modes. Several Google apps provide dark-themed options that are pretty consistent with the fast settings of the dark user interface. The Android Messages app automatically switches depending on the dark theme on Android 10 devices. On Android 9, the Messages app can be set up manually with a dark theme: Start the Messages app. Click on the three-point icon in the top right-hand app right. Click Turn On Dark Mode. From there, your Messages app will immediately flip over to a dark gray background with white text, with colored contact icons keeping its original palette. YouTube has a suitable dark look as well. To do this, click the profile icon in the top right corner of the app. Click General. Tap the switch switch next to a dark theme.
