

Maybe there will be some other explanation: a person seeing a ghost crazy, or being mad by someone else. Maybe the ghost is a manifestation of grief, or be tampered with by a criminal who will be exposed when you whip with a white sheet like Scooby-Doo? You can't make this up. In the case of Platform Seven, I answered this question at the outset by having the whole novel told by a ghost - that of a young woman who died at Peterborough train station and is trapped there until the mystery of her death is solved. This created other problems though -- what could have done Ghost? Can it move objects, pass through walls? Surprisingly hard not to make a ghost narrator ghost-ghost twee. Beloved Toni Morrison (1987) This great testament to the horrors of slavery opens with haunts. 124 was spiteful. The baby's poison. In the house, the women knew about it, as did the children. In the Nobel laureate's most famous book, the ghost of a child killed by his mother to save her from slavery is a malevolence sprite, but also a metaphor for how the great evil of slavery haunts its victims after abolition, haunts America's history and must haunt us all. One intriguing aspect of reading this unresolved story is that, viewed by modern eyes, its ambiguities offer itself as a metaphor for child neglect and domestic sexual abuse. 3. Man Tiger Eka Kurniawan (2015) Ghost stories from different countries provide a cultural barometer of varieties. Ghosts have a strong presence in Indonesian culture and a white tiger that inhabits this story is not only a ghost inside a young Margio killer, but also literally a tiger that can be seen by the villagers. This short, intense and beautiful book was chosen for the longlist of Man Booker International, making Kurniawan the first Indonesian author nominated. Is this really a ghost story? Who cares? 4. The Ghosts of the Tsunami by Richard Lloyd Perry (2017) Is an award-winning nonfiction account of the 2011 tsunami that claimed tens of thousands of lives in Japan not only for the ghost story either, but it's a stunning account of how the living are haunted by the need to bring back their dead. Perry concentrates on the tragedy of Okawa Elementary School, which has lost all but two of its children. Many of his descriptions will haunt you: to me, it was the grieving parents teaching themselves to work mechanical diggers so they could excavate silt and dirt for their children's bodies long after The search gave up. 5. Lincoln's Bardo by George Saunders (2017) This polyphonic tale of multiple ghosts won the 2017 Man Booker Prize - not bad given that it was Saunders' first novel, though he was already a highly acclaimed writer of the story. This concerns President Abraham Lincoln's grief for his young son William and is an interesting and heartbreaking reminder that grief is equally striking for the poor and mighty. 6. Dark Matter by Michelle Paver (2010) This wonderful adult novel from the author of The Chronicles of Ancient Darkness proves that the endlessly inventive writer she is. It opens like many other ghost stories, with the opening of a magazine, in this case written by Jack, a wireless operator on an Arctic expedition that takes place in 1938 as the clouds of war gather in Europe. The group set up camp in a remote bay, but as the polar winter and the endless night around them, they realize that they are not alone ... Mawkish but affecting ... Beautiful Bones by Alice Sebold (2002) This story from the afterlife told the ghost of a 14-year-old murder victim was an instant bestseller when it was published, and was made into a mawkish but still affecting Peter Jackson film starring Saoirse Ronan. Susie Salmon watches from her personal palace as her family grieves and police are unable to catch her killer. In smaller hands it might be sentimental, but such is Sebold's skill and observation that you go with the flow and desperately need a young Susie to find peace and justice for her family. 8. Little Stranger Sarah Waters (2009) A doctor called Hundreds Hall, a dilapidated mansion owned by the Ayres family. Have they just fallen on hard times, like many aristocratic families of the postwar era, or is there something more sinister going on? Waters takes her deep knowledge of Victorian gothic and combines all her usual ability to create something both deliberately traditional and utterly modern in her portrayal of family secrets and class. 9. The Woman in Black by Susan Hill (1983) One of the most famous modern ghost stories thanks to its extremely successful scene and adaptations, Susan Hill's novel has not lost any of its shocking Gothic powers. Located in the sinister Eel Marsh House, cut off from the world completely when the water rises above his leads, a lawyer named Arthur Kipps tries to unravel the case and the deadly history of the house and its owner, the deceased Mrs. Drablow. But the woman in black will haunt him forever. 10. Hotel World Ali Smith (2001) Five narrators haunt this joyful and inventive book, starting with the ghost of a young woman working maid who dies after climbing into a mute waiter on the fourth floor only to prove The cord snaps and down she goes, and her descent is a fitting start to the novel, which rushes headlong through an investigation of grief with a glorious Woooo-hoooo cry (his opening phrase). It's a novel that proves that ghost stories can go anywhere and be anything: charming, poetic and even funny. It really is the most malleable form.
