The risk of very bad and sometimes fatal birth defects is very high if you take ISOTretinoin (systemic) at any time while you are pregnant. Any unborn child can get hurt. There is no good way to tell if an unborn child has suffered. The risk of losing an unborn child is also increased and premature births have occurred. Your doctor will talk about poor exposure before you start you on ISOTretinoin (systemic). If you become pregnant while taking ISOTretinoin (systemic) or within 1 month after you stop taking it, call your doctor immediately. If you know all the facts and can follow how to take ISOTretinoin (systemic), you must sign the patient's fact/consent form. Don't sign the form or take ISOTretinoin (system) if you don't know everything on the form. You should have 2 pregnancy tests that show that you are not pregnant before starting ISOTretinoin (systemic). You should have pregnancy tests done while taking ISOTretinoin (systemic). Talk to your doctor. Use 2 types of birth control 1 month before the onset of ISOTretinoin (systemic), during treatment, and at least 1 month after the last dose. It is used to treat acne (acne).
