

Voting as a process is one of the most important responsibilities of citizens in a democratic state, and this is vital for the success of the state. Voting allows citizens to choose the people who will govern their country and to conduct various policies and procedures that will affect all areas of public and private life. Elections for the Maharashtra State Assembly will be held on October 21, 2019. The votes will be counted on October 24, 2019. However, there are many eligible voters who do not run their franchises for a number of reasons, the main of which is ignorance of the process or lack of relevant information about the steps and procedures to be followed. The State of Maharashtra has taken remedial measures and is implementing various programmes and measures, both to educate and to promote the voting process among citizens. Before voting, people must first obtain a voter ID. Considered a long and cumbersome process, the Department of the Chief Electoral Officer of the State of Maharashtra streamlined the procedure and made it faster and more accessible to all. The chief electoral officer in the state of Maharashtra has introduced an online voter ID application procedure. The application process for one of them has also been simplified, making it convenient for individuals to apply no matter where they are. This system also saves time because they do not need to visit the Electoral Office to collect the necessary forms. The online process of applying for a voter ID in Maharashtra is simple, as described below: The voter ID application process: visit the chief election officer of the Maharashtra website ([www.ceo.maharashtra.gov.in](http://www.ceo.maharashtra.gov.in)) and select the online voter registration option from the tab. The page will be opened with a list of forms and their descriptions. If you register as a new voter, click on Form 6. Fill in the requested items in the form that will be displayed. Download the necessary documents (photo, address id, ID) along with the form and click the submit button. You can also fill out part of the form and save it, which will be completed later. If you complete all the requested information, you'll get an application number that you can use to track your app's status. The way you submitted the form, the details will be checked by the Booth Level Employee (BLO) who will visit your home. You will also be notified of the successful verification of the data you submitted and your voter ID will be sent to your post address. Maharashtra Election 2019 How to apply for a voter ID card offline in Maharashtra Voter ID cards can be applied for offline as well as for those individuals who do not have access to internet sites or are not familiar with online applications. The process of applying for a voter ID offline is below: visit the nearest polling office in your place of residence and request for Form 6, which is a form of registration of a new voter in the electoral rolls. Enter all the details and submit the form along with the necessary supporting documents to the Electoral Office. You can also submit a form to the nearest specially designated voter assistance centers, the list of which is available on the website. Once submitted, a Booth level employee will make a visit to your home to check the details and documents submitted by you. After a successful check, you will be notified after processing the application and receive a voter ID card in the mail at the address mentioned in the questionnaire. Documents to be submitted to apply for voter ID: Latest passport-size proof of age for applicants aged 18 to 21 (school certificate/birth certificate/passport/Aadhaar/PAN Card/bank pass book/driving license, etc.) Proof residence (passport/driver's license/Aadhaar card/diet card/latest utility bills/bank or post office passbook) How to track status in Maharashtra Tracking Voter ID Status Online, to check your voter ID app status online, You can follow the steps of the data below. Visit ceo Maharashtra's website ( . Search by name Select Name Wise Select Area, enter your area, name and click on the Search button. You can also choose the Assembly, enter your district, meeting, name and click on the Search button. Search for EPIC Select your area Enter your map ID number and click on the Search button. Tracking voter ID status via SMS This facility is not available in Maharashtra yet, but may be deployed in the future. By calling the ECI helpline, you can call the toll-free ECI 1950 helpline. The helpline is available on all business days from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. How to apply for a duplicate ID card online in Maharashtra State There may be cases where you have inappropriately or lost your voter ID. Your voter ID may also have been stolen or cannot be used because it is torn/disfigured. In such situations, you will have to apply for a duplicate voter ID in order to their franchise. Steps to apply for a duplicate voter ID are as follows: If your voter ID card has been lost or stolen, you will have to file a FIR (First Information Report) at your local police station. Go to The Chief Commissioner for Elections India website and download Form 002, which is to apply a duplicate of the voter ID. Complete the form with all the relevant details and attach the supporting documents on request (along with a copy of the FIR). Send the same to your local polling headquarters, after which you will receive confirmation. You will receive a duplicate of your voter ID either through the mail or you can pick it up in person from the election office. How to apply for a duplicate of your voter ID offline in Maharashtra State If you have lost or misplaced your voter ID card, you can apply for a duplicate voter ID card as follows: If your voter ID card has been lost, misplaced or stolen, you will have to file an EPI at your local police station. Take a copy of the FIR and collect Form 002 at your local polling office. If your voter ID card is disfigured or torn, take a card from 3 p.m. when you visit your local polling office. Complete the form requested with the information and attach the supporting documents. Send the form and documents to the office, after which you will receive confirmation. You will receive a duplicate of your voter ID when you check the documents you submit. As you make adjustments to your voter id card online in Maharashtra there are times when your voter ID card may have the wrong name or error in your contact details, for example. Since voter ID is an official document, you should always correct any errors as soon as possible. The procedure for correcting information on your voter id card is this: visit the website of the Chief Election Officer in Maharashtra and click on the online voter registration tab on the homepage. Click on Form 8, which is a form to correct details on an existing voter id card. There will be an online form. Enter the requested data and download the necessary documents. To change a name, download an official document, such as a marriage certificate or a government messenger. To change the address, download the document with the correct address (e.g. passport/pass/driver's license/electricity bill, etc.) Once you have downloaded and filled out all the information, click to submit. You'll get instant confirmation in the form of a reference number that you can use to verify the status of your app online. Your application will be processed by the authorities. If you successfully verify, you will receive a voter ID with changes either by mail or you can pick it up in person from the electoral office. How to make adjustments to the voter id card offline in Maharashtra state In case your voter ID card has errors when it comes to certain details such as your name, address or other data, you can correct the information by applying in this regard. Steps to make corrections to your voter ID card offline are below: Visit the polling office and Form 8, which is a questionnaire to make adjustments to the voter ID. Fill in the details on request and attach the documents with the correct name/address. To change the name, attach a copy of the official notice to the messenger or marriage certificate. To correct the address, attach a copy of the official document mentioning the correct address (e.g. food cards, Aadhar card, passport, driver's license, etc.). Send your form and supporting documents to the campaign headquarters. Once your application is verified, you will receive a corrected voter ID through the mail or you can pick it up in person from the electoral office. How to change your address in the voter ID card online in Maharashtra Persons registered in a particular constituency may no longer live in the same area. However, if you have not updated your modified address in your voter ID card, you are not eligible to vote in the election where you currently live. If this is a permanent change of address, you will need to remove your name from the voter lists in your locality and add your name to the voter list in your place of residence. Now it is possible to do it in one step, to apply for a transposition of the name from the electoral roll. With this statement, your name will not only be added to your current district's electoral roll, but will also be removed from your old electoral roll. Your voter ID card will also be updated with your current address. The office of the electoral officer in the State of Maharashtra has made it easier for individuals to change their addresses on their constituent identity cards at present, as they can do so in a few simple steps on the Internet. The online process is below: Go to the website of the Chief Election Officer in Maharashtra and select Form 8A from the Online Voter Registration link, which is a form for address transposition. Fill in the details on request and download supporting documents for your current address, such as utility bills, etc. You will be given a reference number that you can use to track the status of the app. Once you have verified the information you

provide, you will receive a voter ID card with the corrected address. How to change your voter ID card offline in Maharashtra As a registered voter, your voter ID card should always be updated and listed the most recent information. In case you change your address, your voter ID card should also reflect this change. This is to register you on the electoral rolls of the constituency where you currently reside, while your name will be removed from the lists by residence. The process of changing the address on the voter ID card offline is now much easier, with the steps mentioned below: Visit Visit campaign headquarters or campaign headquarters in the constituency where you live and collect Form 8A, a statement form for a change of address. Complete the form requested and attach documents to support your current address, such as electricity bills or phone bills. Send the completed form to the office where you will receive confirmation of the same. Once the information you provide is verified, you will receive a voter ID with a new address via mail, or you can pick it up in person from the office.
