The automatic rotation function can sometimes be inconvenient, because even a subtle shift to the side will change the orientation of the screen to the landscape or portrait mode. Android 9.0 brings the screen rotation lock button to the navigation bar, which lets you flip the orientation and keep it locked there until you turn back and press the button again. To turn the screen into landscape mode, turn your phone into a landscape position and tap the Screen Rotation Lock button in the left corner of the navigation bar. Smartphone users around the world know how annoying it is to auto-rotate enabled, as the slightest change in the orientation of the phone can sometimes transform the entire screen into landscape mode at the wrong time. Google has a simple cure for this in the latest version of Android, and it includes shutting down auto-turn completely. Setting up the screen rotation for older versions of Android, all you can do is keep the automatic rotation or turning it off. When it's entered, place your phone in a landscape orientation, and the app will fit that mode. Turn it off and each app remains locked in portrait orientation. Keeping it off is less frustrating than dealing with random screen rotations, but turning it back when you need landscape mode isn't a quick action.
