Other articles on Indonesian language study; Requirement of Indonesian language for expats in Indonesia by Indonesian Labor Minister Hanif Dakiri announced in early January 2015 his intention to comply with a decree requiring foreign workers to pass the Bahasa Indonesia test to obtain a work permit. The exam will be part of a new set of requirements that will determine a foreigner's right to work in the archipelago. It is included in the current revision of the ruling of the Ministry of Human Resources.
