Since the habit of reading has returned forever to my life in 2013, I have been looking for an app to help me organize reading. But since I never found one that was exactly what I wanted, I ended up doing some adaptations: I used the Clear List app (which is very cool and versatile by the way) to record books read separately in a month; and took notes on the readings in a physical notebook (which was very charming but impractical). Here, last week, @sobreuniviro, USA, talked about my Readings app in InstaStories, and I've already run out to download. I ended up learning that it was only made for Android, but inadvertently came across Leio, which is all I ever wanted to use the app for a week, but it was enough to keep me (and it gets a warning, it only works on the iPhone!). So, for those looking for an app to organize reading, I did a review of the Leio features: 1. Current reading in the Reading tab, you record your current reading (oh, actually? haha) and if you want, you can take a picture of the book cover to make the app cuter. For those who read more than one work at a time, the paid version of the app allows you to add more titles. On each reading page, you can add a title, an author, and the number of pages of a book. And for those who love Kindle features, Leio is a complete plate! The app notes the reading percentage, the time left to complete the book, and, based on the reading rate, calculates the forecast to complete the work. For those who like to take notes and celebrate quotes, the app has reserved places exclusively for this! One thing I loved about Leio was reading sessions. They note how many pages you've read, how long and help you calculate the reading speed (before you start, you mark the page you start and then note where you ended up). I confess, it's hard to remember to start, pause and finish each session, but it's worth aiming for! 2. Write a reading in the Archive tab, all your readings are divided month by month. By clicking on the name, you can view the registration date, annotations, quotes, etc. 3. Stats in the Planning tab, you can learn a little more about your reading habits. If you register sessions correctly, the app tells you how long and how many pages you read on a given day. You can also set reading goals for each day, which always gives an extra incentive (at least for me). Registration reading sessions is also legal for, at the end of a week, month, year or life (haha) to learn other details of your habits: for how many hours you read; how many sessions there were; how many pages have been read. And with all this data, the app calculates your average pace. And for those who love goals and challenges, the app records your achievements (my funny because I downloaded a week ago, hahaha). Do you know Leio? Do you use any reading apps? This app is only available in the App Store for iPhone and iPad. Take control of your testimony. Use Leio to time your reading sessions and stay motivated. How many books have you read this year? How much did you finish? How long do you have time to read them? Hello, Gustavo. Thank you so much for the feedback! You've seen that you can organize books with labels in the archive, haven't you? Simply select the box button in the top right corner. The reading list is designed to keep the books that you are currently reading in the spotlight, so the intention is that this list is not too long. The archive, on the other hand, is made to maintain a larger list of all the books you have read over time. When you finish the book, the Reading option now changes to the Archive, but you can also archive the books before you finish them by clicking on in the top right corner of each book's page. However, I plan to add more options to organize and order books soon! I just wanted to make the current options clearer. :) Hug me, Daniel. I think it's time for the app to convert just how many pages are equal % read, that is, in the case of e-books, if I read 10% of the 100 pages it should count 10 pages to read, not 0 pages and 10%. I think this simple improvement is crucial for an application of this size. I'm also looking forward to text recognition testing. I think I'm going to sign very soon. You will add pages and read the time in your book account and this will be reflected in the statistics. In addition to being an app to organize your library, it will also serve to maintain control. In statistics you can see how many pages have been read each day, how long you read each day, or a consistent total number of reading days. You can also unlock insignia in Achievements.
