

UNHCR, the UN refugee agency, today issued new guidelines on the loss and deprivation of citizenship. This guidance is intended to assist Governments and policy makers in interpreting relevant international law. Decisions to strip people of citizenship have serious and far-reaching consequences not only for the people themselves, but also for society as a whole. This is by no means an ideal or in the interests of any state, so that people are left stateless and on the margins of society, said UNHCR Assistant High Commissioner for Protection Gillian Triggs. While in most cases this practice is increasingly being used as a punitive measure, we hope that this guide will promote a principled and consistent approach to decision-making in order to reduce the risk of statelessness under the law. The guidelines provide interpretations of the 1961 Convention on the Reduction of Statelessness, one of two key stateless treaties that, together with the 1954 Convention on the Status of Stateless Persons, provide a legal basis for preventing the emergence of statelessness and protecting stateless persons. They also provide guidelines on complementary international human rights relating to the revocation of citizenship. The loss of nationality refers to circumstances where a person's nationality may be automatically revoked as a result of the functioning of the law, for example, where national law stipulates that citizenship will be lost in situations of long-term residence abroad. Deprivation of rights refers to situations where the state actively deprives citizenship of its citizens. Since the right to citizenship is widely recognized as a fundamental human right, international law prohibits arbitrary deprivation of citizenship, including for racial, ethnic, religious or political reasons. As a rule, the 1961 Convention also prohibits the deprivation of citizenship when it leaves a stateless person. There are very limited exceptions to this rule, including in cases where citizenship has been acquired, albeit a distortion or fraud, in specific circumstances, where countries explicitly reserve the right to do so when they join the Convention and provisions already exist in national law, conduct incompatible with duty it may also be grounds for exclusion from the prohibition, where, for example, it seriously harms the vital interests of the State. However, governments be required to determine whether decisions to deprive a person of nationality lead to statelessness, as well as to ensure that procedural safeguards, such as the right to a fair trial, are respected. In accordance with its mandate on statelessness, UNHCR provides guidance on relevant international law. The guidelines on the loss and revocation of citizenship are the fifth in a series of guidelines on statelessness issued by the agency. The full recommendations are available here.
