Whether you're looking for something campy or downright scary, these reviews and roundups will help you find the perfect horror movie. Get ready to be scared of movies about zombies, ghosts, serial killers and more. Stephen King is the undisputed king of modern horror literature, but when it comes to films based on his writings, the level of success - both commercially and artistically - becomes increasingly unsustainable. Here, however, is a sure list of winners. In fact, this is the 10 best movies and miniseries adaptation of The King's Story to date (in chronological order). And no, Mangler 2 is nowhere to be found. Proms and telekinesis don't mix. Some of the styles and effects haven't stood the test of time, but the superb performances of Sissy Spacek and Piper Laurie (both of whom were nominated for Oscars for these roles) are a timeless, propelling film that, while a little overrated, is still entertaining and trendsetter in its day. The 2013 remake was the polar opposite: the whole flash, with a sterile, hollow, emotionless core. It may have been made for television, but Lot Salem provides theatrical thrills and chills. It tells the story of an author who returns to his hometown, only to discover that the vampire has moved in and steadily turning everyone into the creatures of the night. Because it's a miniseries, there's time to develop multiple plot points, humanize characters and increase fear and tragedy. The caretaker and his family move to an isolated hotel at the end of winter and have to deal with his spectral inhabitants in this classic ghost movie. This adaptation of King's novel is probably the best of the author's films and is easily one of the scariest movies of all time. The TV miniseries was produced in 1997, which was right to the book, but it was nowhere near as creepy - partly because Stephen Weber wasn't Jack Nicholson. Unlike most of King's films, the author actually wrote the script for this anthology of creepy stories. Tales include zombie revenge, killer alien plants, monster in a box and cockroach invasion. The original title, Creepshow on the dance floor, was nixed for being too funky. Only regarding the horrific yet thoroughly entertaining, the dead zone involves a teacher developing the ability to see the future after a car accident lands him in a coma for five years. Unlike those who squander their psychic abilities - Miss Cleo - Johnny (Christopher Walker) uses his talent to solve murders, save children from drowning and prevent nuclear war. You are welcome. The Silver Bullet is the last of a dying breed: a charming tale of coming of age, wrapped in the terrible mystery of the murder of a werewolf, starring a serial Corey Haim. eerie and well acted with a heartfelt family resonance, this about the cemetery that has the ability to resuscitate the body buried there atmospheric enough to resist the resist flaws - not least of which is less than intimidating a toddler who returns from the grave with a penchant for murder. If you're not afraid of clowns, it can cure that irrational non-fear quickly. Tim Curry's uber-creepy performance as Pennywise the Dancing Clown adds scary, while the 1960 memoir added Stand By Me-ish nostalgia, making it the best King-based miniseries. A great combination of dark comedy and horror, Misery has become one of those rare, iconic cultural landmarks, thanks to Kathy Bates' Oscar performance and the introduction of one of the most stal ft worthless words in English: loving. Directed by horror master George Romero, the often overlooked Dark Half precedes similar movies Number 23 and King's Own Secret Window. It revolves around an author whose alias develops his own mind and seeks to kill anyone he considers responsible for his death. It's not particularly scary, but Needful Things is a relentlessly entertaining look at the nature of evil, featuring dark comedy stripes. Where else are you going to see a priest and a minister quit? Max von Sydow is brilliant as one of the best devils in cinematic history. Alternately scary, funny and touching, 1408 packs evil-shining at the Overlook Hotel into one hotel room. You can't take your eyes off the trippy visuals in this one person play of sorts, starring John Cusack. Maximum Overdrive is the only film that the king has directed and with good reason. It's by no means a good movie, but it's part of its overwhelming camp appeal. There's something inherently hilarious about whether a lawnmower is chasing down a man or a skating rink pancaking little leaguers, not to mention a killer vending machine and a demonic ice cream truck. From the AC/DC soundtrack to the demolition of derby car crashes to explosions that blow things up to real good, Maximum Overdrive is a cheesy good time.
