Cargo insurance provides coverage against physical damage or loss of goods during transport, whether by land, sea or air. Because of the many dangers inherent in shipping, most individuals and businesses prefer to insure their goods while they are on the move. While this is called all-risk, most policies exclude many types of damage from coverage. These may include damage from improper packaging, contamination, refusal of customs, abandonment of cargo and dishonesty of employees, among others. When covering all risks, it is very important to carefully examine your policies to determine what types of losses are not covered by insurance. The advantage of the whole risk is that there is no need to prove the responsibility of the carrier first to claim damages. Insurance will be paid no matter who is to blame. A sentence containing one or more conditional reservations and a basic provision expressing the result of a condition is called a suspended sentence or conditional construction. The conditional provision is most often imposed by a subordinated compound, if; other conditional subordinations include, even if, provided that, provided that as long as the case. Conditional provisions usually come at the beginning of complex proposals - proposals containing an independent reservation and one or more but, like other adverbs, may also come at the end. But what is the condition? Ronald Carter and Michael McCarthy define this in their book Cambridge Grammar English. Conditions relate to imaginary situations: some are possible, some are unlikely, some are impossible. The Speaker/writer imagines that something may or may not happen or happened, and then compares this situation with possible consequences or results, or offers further logical conclusions about the situation , (Carter and McCarthy 2006). As mentioned, a conditional provision could be set either at the beginning or at the end of the sentence. Author Kenneth A. Adams explains how best to decide where to place this kind of position: Conditional provisions have traditionally been placed at the beginning of the sentence, but you should feel free to place a conditional position elsewhere if this will make the provision easier to read. The longer the conditional provision, the more likely it is that the provision will be more readable with a matrix clause rather than a conditional position at the front of the sentence. If both the conditional provision and the matrix clause contain more than one element, you will most likely be better off expressing them as two sentences (Adams 2013). There are six main types of suspended sentences based on probability and tension: general rule/law of nature, open future state, unlikely future state, impossible future state, impossible state of the past and unknown past state. Below are definitions and examples from them, presented by John Seeley in Grammar for Teachers. General rule: This event or action is the law of nature, it always happens. Example: The balance between the liquid and the steam is disturbed if the temperature rises. Open Future Condition: This event or action may or may not occur. Example: If you start thinking about this game, it will drive you crazy.

Hardly a future condition: This event or action probably won't happen. Example: But if you really want to be on a Malibu beach, you would be there. Impossible future condition: This event or action can never happen. Example: I would go to the convention center myself and ask to see someone safe. Impossible state of the past: This past event or action did not occur. Example: I would resign if they made their own decision. Unknown state of the past: The terms of this past event or action are unknown; it could have happened, and it probably wasn't. Example: If he worked for three days and three nights, he would have been in the suit he was wearing now, (Seely 2007).
