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I found dirty water merged inside our Bosch dishwasher: Here's how I repaired the problem and the diy troubleshooting guide to fixing yours. See the pool of water? Our Bosch dishwasher didn't drain. After our built-in Bosch ran the cycle, the bottom of the dishwasher was still full of dirty, free-standing water. Here's how it should work: There is a drainage pump in the dishwasher that pushes water through the hose that usually runs from the dishwasher to either the garbage sink or the air gap. (Our air gap is placed on top of our sink. If your dishwasher is not draining, something along this path is blocked or broken. Here are the troubleshooting measures. How do I unlock the drain of the dishwasher? Check and clean the filter. Clear the air gap for clogging and damage. Check the drainage hose. Learn how to do each of these treatments, with video tutorials, below.

1. Check the filter inside the first There dishwasher is the screen at the bottom of the dishwasher, which should block large debris from going into the drainage hose, but sometimes the pieces of food pass and clog the hose. The video below shows how to check and clean the filter. If you find a large piece of food or glass, remove it and then run a rinse cycle to see if the dishwasher drains. If this is still not the case, move on to the next step. Check out Air Gap for Clogs

The most common problem that prevents the Bosch dishwasher from draining small pieces of food caught in the air gap. Fortunately, it's very easy to fix. Find the air gap. It is usually a small hood or cylinder at the back of the sink. Remove the lid. Most just unscrew or pop out by hand, but some have a small screw that keeps it in place. At the top of the air gap there is a small piece that can be removed by depressing small hooks. Remove the top and clean everything clogged inside. How it should work: Water is pumped out of the dishwasher through an air gap (it's a built-in plastic tube) and then tends down through a larger hose to remove debris. The problem is that when water gets to the top of the air gap, small pieces of food get stuck between the plastic lid and the built-in tube. This prevents the hose from working effectively so that the dishwasher does not completely drain. Surprisingly, a huge problem tiny bit of food can cause. If you remove a bunch of garbage, the problem is most likely solved. Run the dishwasher on a rinse cycle and see if all the water is pumped out. If not, move on to the next step. What to do if I don't have a gap Some units skip the air gap and drain directly into the garbage disposal using the so-called high drain loop, which is an extra-long (at least 32 high) drainage pipe that is attached to the bottom of the countertop. If you have a high drain loop, go to #3. Pull cover over Air gap and check for debris and tiny pieces of food. How to unpack air Gap3. Check the presence of drainage hoses to separate the drainage hose from the air gap (or debris removal) you need.... Bucket screwdrivers pliers Use screwdrivers and pliers, disable the drainage hose that is attached to the air gap (or debris removal), drain the water, and check if the hose is blocked. You will only be able to see the section of runoff that is under the sink. To see if the drainage hose is blocked, run the dishwasher on a rinse cycle and keep the hose over the bucket. If the dishwasher does not merge, the drainage hose is blocked. You can try to use a plumber snake or hanger to push out the clog. If you can't find a clog in the drain section under the sink, this is probably in the part you can't see right behind the dishwasher. Most drainage hoses pass through a hole in the cupboard and the dishwasher may need to be pulled out completely for a more thorough inspection. Before you pull it out, you need to unscrew two L brackets that connect the top of the dishwasher from the bottom of the counter. You may also have to adjust the height of the dishwasher by screwing your feet below to give you a gap at the top. If it's too complicated, maybe it's time to call the plumber. It is an air gap that has been disconnected from the drainage hose and debris removal. This article is accurate and true to the best of the author's knowledge. The questions and answers: What does the Bosch e23 code mean? Answer: The e23 error in the Bosch dishwasher is an electrical problem with a drainage pump. This may require the replacement of the drainage pump. The question is: Why collect clean water at the bottom of the dishwasher if it doesn't work every day? Answer: It is possible that the drainage hose bypasses the air gap and connects directly to the garbage disposal. Without an air gap, water from the sink can flow back into the dishwasher, so you might have the sink water flowing back in. Answer: The control valve is sometimes used instead of an air gap. Its purpose is to prevent the flow of water back in the opposite direction. The question is: Why won't it drain when the drainage hose is clear? A: There are several possibilities. The most common is clogged airgap, clogged filter, and bad pump. The first two are easy to fix. A bad pump is more expensive. There is also the possibility that the board management is bad. Look for error codes and call the repair shop and they can help you. A: I have a Bosch dishwasher that I had for about 5 years. Today, he just stopped draining, and the puck started honking. I Am I a filter that doesn't seem to be clogged. I'm checking the drainage line, and there wasn't a lot of water in it. The puck won't rinse, or wash anything. Any suggestions? Answer: Sometimes the beep is accompanied by an error code. Check the error code. Looks like you've done major troubleshooting. I'd try calling a home appliances store where you bought it and see if you can talk to a repairman. They will often have additional tips on troubleshooting or be able to give you an estimate of what the likely part will cost to replace it. The question: My 2017 Bosch dishwasher is not draining properly. It shows E24 as an error code. I took out the filter and cleaned it, but there is a lag of dirty water. Can you suggest what I may need to do? Answer: The e24 error code may be associated with several problems. For a DIY person, we suggest first making sure to check the valve clearly. Then check the hoses for kinks and make sure the filters are clean. These are the main steps. After that, the dishwasher may have problems with the pump or control panel and will require pulling the dishwasher out. For most people, this is where we recommend calling a repairman. For new models, it is possible that it is still under warranty. Why does the water come out of the air gap of my Bosch dishwasher? A: There are several possibilities. Air clearances are designed to prevent water from escaping back through the hose. Thus, the two main possibilities are to lock or break in the hose or clog in the air gap. Another but rather unlikely cause is an air gap below the water, causing a siphon of sorts. Take an air gap apart and check into small pieces like a piece of carrot. That's probably the culprit. The question: My Bosch dishwasher continues to invent either the E18 or E14 on display. It was not empty and had a large pool of water at the bottom. Any suggestions? A: These errors are not related to the problem of drying, but to the problem of flow and water level. Probably something prevents enough water from flowing into the dishwasher. The question: The water in my dishwasher sits below the filter, in the sump machine. Will vinegar and bi-coal remove any clogs or do I have to pull out the machine and check the pipes by hand? Answer: A little water sitting under the filter is normal. It is possible that there is no check valve that can cause it or as the old Bosch dishwashers work, they are not completely dry, so a small amount of water can be collected. However, rinsing the cycle with vinegar will not hurt anything. The only downside is that the small amount of water below the filter can start to smell if the dishwasher is used infrequently. If so, leave the dishwasher crack open to dry and Filter. For a very small amount of water below the filter, I wouldn't pull the machine to check for clogging. © 2010 Paul Paul Cole on January 03, 2020 Got 3 times error message on my Bosch 2017 model Ascenta dishwasher. I found the cause of the problem. Just remove the kitchen sink drain plug to evacuate the pressure from the pump! Immediately after installation, the device is completely drained and then pour water from the drain after about 1-1.5 hours. The problem was fixed and there were no additional problems. But, at some point, you could hear a short rumble and what sounds like water passes, and of course there's water at the bottom of the dishwasher. I have to run a short loop to clean it up. There are 1 or 2 cups in the mine. I can't decide if it's okay or not. Our Bosch gets stuck at various points in the middle of the rinse cycle and I'm trying to determine if it's a pump issue or not. You can also leave the door slightly cracked open and that will help as well. I don't think it affects the dishwasher, but the newest models have different drying features. I think it's more a matter of perception. Glenis Rix from September 09, 2017: Bosch dishwasher is a fairly new addition to my kitchen, and I had the same problems as Jerry, so your response to it has set my mind to some extent. But I am concerned that if I am away from home for a long time (such as vacation) and therefore do not use the machine regularly stagnant water can cause bacteria and start to smell unpleasant. I wonder if the incomplete drainage design malfunctions? I take out the filter once a week to rinse it (according to my instructions) and run the cycle with the dishwasher cleaning the liquid every few weeks. Easy Fix for bosch dishwasher error code E24 on September 09, 2017: Thank you! When I removed it from the drainage line trap there was water in it up to the top. I went and got a garden hose and I flushed the water back into the dishwasher (take off the filter mesh first) and the decrepiper did get out. I have a hand pump that small boat owners use to pull the water back out of the dishwasher. Works big now. It was great not to have to take off any hoses or having to pull the dishwasher out. My hoses allow the air to come in and out, so I don't think they're clogged. The back thread tab about the drainage system made break and was removed. Will this prevent the device from pushing the drainage water into the socket at my disposal? If it's not, what else should I check? The engine is running and the pump pumps water, it just won't go out of the pump into the socket. I would appreciate input, than I decide to junk it or spend more money. The flap is not expensive, but if something else involved I would identify these costs before spending time and money per unit. It is also possible that the line from the air gap to the removal is blocked. First, run the deletion and try to run the puck on the rinse loop to see if it fixes the problem. Then check the line from the air gap to remove. It's rare, but you can also try to replace or bypass the air gap. Sue on August 29, 2017: There is a Bosch dishwasher and the air gap has dirty water after every wash! I can check and clean air burst, but the same thing happens again. Anyway, these people did another job in my house and their lack of knowledge regarding codes is astounding. They repaired the reverse flow prevention on my sprinkler system by installing a cheapo non-reverse flow connector preventing. Guess what? Soon I had an air hammer, a loud thud in my walls. When I insisted that they were doing the job more with reverse-preventing flow that I bought, the knock went off. They also installed a microwave too close to the stove, so they had to redo it, and now I have two huge holes in the tile under my microwave. Beggars can't be a choice, it was all my father's gifts to me, but I would rather not burn my house because of code violations on the microwave or poison my family with a reverse stream from my yard entering my drinking water.
