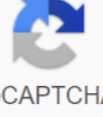

Police ordered protesters from the area. Vocal verbs provide information about how to make a statement. Vocal adverbs are often used to provide additional information about the feeling of being a speaker when making a statement. For example, the vocal adverb gladly indicates that something is said with great pleasure. For example, He was happy to proclaim the news! indicates that the speaker is satisfied with the declaration.
