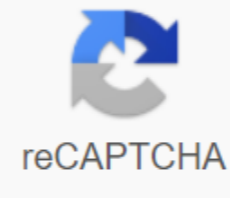


Rubber band bracelet making instructions

If you don't have any gum at home or in the office, holding things like file folders or other small items together can be difficult. Fortunately, different alternatives to office gum supplies depending on the specific task at hand. If you need to keep a file folder or parcel together, you can always use some strings to get the job done. Although not as flexible as gum, it is usually possible to hold larger items together tightly with a string than would be possible with a standard rubber band. Parcel strings, made of cotton, is a thin, sturdy twine that is both affordable and very functional; it can be used to hold together a stack of papers, posters, envelopes, file folders, boxes and other packages. You can find string in office supplies or craft stores, or online. Staples are another standard alternative to gum depending on the task you are trying to accomplish. For example, staples are often more effective in keeping stacks of papers together than rubber bands because they make it easy to access all pages without cancelling the entire package. Heavy staples are also useful in holding boxes and other parcels together. Depending on the intensity of the tasks performed in your office or home, you will need to choose the appropriate stapler; They vary in size, price and quality, and are usually available for purchase in office stores or online. Once you have chosen the stapler, you will need to purchase appropriate staples that are the right size and shape to work with the new device. Staples are usually quite affordable, but they are often used quickly. It is important that your home or office is stocked with staples, and refill your stapler as needed. If you don't want to pierce the items that you're trying to hold together, paper clips are a good option. They come in a wide variety of shapes, sizes and colors, and are made of metal or plastic. Metal paper clips are the most common, and are usually very economical as they are reusable. The standard paperclip size (1 3/8 inches) is usually elliptical in shape and is best suited for holding together smaller stacks of papers or envelopes. For larger stacks, you can choose heavier debt paper clips that are also available for purchase in office stores or online. For specialized projects, as a rule, most often you can see plastic paper clips. They are often patterned or colored, so they help to color encode different documents, or simply to make a page or page stand out from the rest. Put one rubber band on the first pin. Then drag one of its ends onto the second pin next to the row you are using. Then take another one and drag one end diagonally. Keep doing this until you reach the top. Turn over your loom so that the pins were addressed to you. Grab the hook. NOT LOOPING THE FIRST GROUP. Then take the second group and place it on the third. Keep doing this until you reach the top. Grab 1 C-clip and place it on the strip you just loop. Then gently rinse it off the loom. end and place it on a C-clip.
