You're having trouble listening to sounds on Bluetooth speakers. The speaker can play with distorted sound at excessive volumes. Try to reduce the volume to see if the distortion of the sound will be solved. The roar of the speaker can distort the sound. To avoid knocking or moving the speaker, place the speaker on a hard, roving and hard surface. The speakers on the device can become defective over time, causing the sound to become distorted and speakers need to be replaced. Follow the Speaker Replacement Guide for a step-by-step guide to replacing speakers. The speaker is on, but the speaker doesn't play the sound. The speaker must have the volume turned on to the appropriate level in order for the sound to be heard. Click the K button at the top of the speaker to turn up the volume. When you connect an external device through an auxiliary connector, the speaker will not play sounds from the external device. If the auxiliary cord used to connect the external device is faulty, the speaker will not play sound from the external device. Try using another auxiliary cord to see if the speaker will play. It is important that you leave a lid when you do not have access to the input to keep the device waterproof. Under the lid you will find a battery indicator, a 3.5 mm analog audio input and a USB port that can be used to charge your smartphone. Here you connect the microUSB cable to charge BRV-1. On the right side, you can loop the included strap through to provide a firmer grip on the speaker as you wear it. RuggednessThe BRV-1 is rated IPX-7, which means you can put it under water (at a depth of up to 1 meter) for 30 minutes and it should continue to play. Although this level of waterproofing is remarkable, it is not unique among Bluetooth speakers; G-Drop has the same IPX rating. To add to the strength, Braven enclosed drivers in aluminum and hard rubber so they could withstand a lot of abuse. I dropped the BRV-1 from 10 feet into the snow bank and left it there for five minutes. After that, the unit had no problems. Strong speakers with big drivers such as G-Project G-Drop provide more sound, as do the wider (but not durable) speakers such as the Jawbone Mini Jambox (\$99). BRV-1 sounds best when playing rock and pop. Despite its small small The BRV-1 delivers strong bass. On Mark Ronson's Uptown Funk, the boom bass drum and bass line roared. The brave speaker also plays vocals well; Robert Plant's singing rose above Jimmy Page's distorted guitar and John Bonham drums on Houses of the Holy. The weak points of the speaker become more evident in symphonic music and jazz. The horns in the jazz classic Cannonball Adderley Autumn leaves fall flat, not having brightness. G-Drop performed better on both jazz and symphonic music, with a big kick in the horns, although its only driver still will not please most fans. With 6 W power, the BRV-1 can get pretty loud for a small speaker. At the maximum volume it produced more than 80 decibels, although it sounded distorted. By comparison, Soundfreaq's pocket kick maxed out at just below 80 decibels. I found the BRV-1 sound more enjoyable at 70 decibels, which would be enough in many situations, but wouldn't rise above the noise of a big batch. This is twice as much as you can expect from the G-Drop. You charge the BRV-1 through the microUSB port found under the screw lid on the back speaker. The BRV-1 can also act as a backup battery for your mobile phone (but it doesn't generate enough energy to charge your tablet). It's best to think of the dynamics of the 1400 mAh battery as an extra charge though; The iPhone 6 requires 1810 mAh for full charging. And, any power you use to increase your phone's charge reduces the speaker's playback time. The \$99 BRV-1 offers an attractive combination of portability, strength and price. \$50 G-Project G-Drop and \$230 Fugoo Tough both deliver the best sound, but the first is much bulky and doesn't last that long and the latter is more than twice as expensive. Whether you plan to listen mostly in extreme conditions, or even by the pool, BRV-1 is the most appropriate. Fit.
