Strathcona County unveils its new leisure software system: Vacation Online, in January 2020. This new system will replace Click-It, which has been an online registration system since 2005. Photo Supplied Catch You Later, Click-It. In late January 2020, Strathcona County will move to a new holiday registration system called Rest Online. Leisure and culture users can expect a new, easy-to-use website, improved search features, mobile user-friendly app experience, and customized username and password. The new feature will offer to search for online accessibility for some holiday destinations. It is time for us to provide a new system, with new technologies that can adapt to the future needs of our community, Carmen Anton, A manager with the county's recreation, parks and culture department said during a council update at a priorities committee meeting on October 22. To prepare for the move, residents can update their email address in their current Click-It account, record or print any important historical information (such as the level of swimming lessons they may need, and register early for all programs before December 31, 2019, to avoid any service breaks. Any balances on the accounts, either because of the user or the balance with the county must also be cleared. Winter registration starts on November 26 and December 3 for swimming. Users can also purchase 2020 passes early to facilitate the transition to the new system. Customers who have an active account will have to have The information has moved into the new software as well. Information will include things such as customer information, membership, ongoing registration programs, existing booking facilities, and with the help of employees users can access historical transactions. Since 2005, Click-It, in addition to the software-grade system, has been used by leisure, parks and culture and transit to provide services that include basic features of ticket sales and passes, reception, booking facilities and registration programs (both in person and online) - handling more than \$20 million in transactions per year. However, the software can no longer be supported after 2020, so subsequent councils have approved funding for the transition to 2014, 2015 and 2018 budgets. When it was first launched in 2005, Click-It saw about 10 percent of registrations take place, up from 89 percent in 2017, representing about 40,000 users. Tests and training of staff are under way before work begins at the end of January 2020. Staff will review the technology for several weeks at the beginning of the month before it is released to the public. We aim for minimal impact on users in Go-Live, with a long-term solution that exceeds expectations, added Anton. Ward 4 Coun. Bill Tonita asked if the new technology would be able to allow county residents to sign up for certain programs a day before residents who live elsewhere like Edmonton and Fort Saskatchewan. Staff noted that the system may have the flexibility to do so because it tracks mail codes, but is not a review in the current configuration, but can be considered if desired. Currently, nearly 90 percent of recreational facility users from Strathcona County.
