One popular method of malware is to wrap a cracked Android app into malicious software. You will still be able to use the app, but the malicious software will also be Run. If your phone seemed to have a problem, you can restore it to the factory setting by default and get rid of all the malware. These days, malware is created to make money - often for organized crime. It is easier for malware to make more money if it can trick you into believing that there is no problem and work under the radar. For example, a McAfee study conducted less than a year ago showed that Android.FakeInstaller was the most common family of malware - more than 60% of the samples of Android malware discovered by McAfee were from the FakeInstaller family.
