You probably know that you can double-click on the screen to zoom in on some text, but if you want to change how far you zoom, you can adjust the zoom level in your browser settings. While you can usually zoom in with a multitouch pinch, some people really like the double tap for its simplicity, but by default it scales too far. To change that, just type in your browser settings (in the default browser, it's under the menu of the settings) and change the default zoom settings. By default it's set to average, but I prefer far away, although some may even prefer to close if you want to get your text close and personal. Are there great videos on your Android you want to edit and make even better? You can if you know how to edit videos on Android. This article walks you through a variety of techniques, including using Google Photos to trim or crop videos, YouTube cut or slice videos, and Kinemaster or Adobe Premiere Rush for multi-layered masterpiece videos. The instructions in this article apply to both the Android phone warehouse and Samsung phones. The Google Photos app on Android includes the ability to cut or crop a video that you recorded using the camera app. You probably already have the Google Photos app on your device, since many Android phones include the default app, but if the Google Photos app isn't on your phone, you can quickly install it using the Google Play Store. The next steps you through are how to cut and/or crop videos with the Google Photos app on Android. Make sure the video you want to edit is already stored on Android. Open the Google Photos app. Look for the video you want to edit. Click on the video you want to edit to open it. The video will start playing on your device. Device. screen outside of the video to display editing options. Click on the Edit icon, which is three horizontal lines with a vertical mark through each (bottom middle of the screen) to access editing options. The video will be displayed with two white Edit handles, one on the left and one on the right. Tap and hold the Edit handle and then drag the handle to adjust the length of the video. Repeat this step with another editing pen, if desired. Click Save the Copy in the top right corner to save the video. That's it. Google Photos now retains both the original video and the trimmed video. If you want to trim or crop videos on Samsung, there are built-in controls in the gallery providing access to the basics. Much like the controls for Google Photos, you can trim and crop the video, but you also have options to customize video resolution, change the ratio of the sides, and add filters and other artistic touches. On a Samsung device, go and open the video you want to edit. Click on the pencil icon in the bottom left corner. Tap and drag at both ends of the video frame line at the bottom of the screen to trim the video. If you don't want to make any further changes, click Save in the top right corner to save a copy of the cropped video. The original video will also remain on your device, unchanged. If you wish, you can also click on any of the icons on the editing toolbar: Add a filter. Apply Beauty Mode. Add Closed captioning. Add stickers/emojis. Make creative changes to coloring and temperature. Adjust the speed of video playback. Add music to the video. You can also click The Resolution at the top of the screen to change the video resolution and reduce the file size for the video. Even if your Android device lacks the Google Photos app, your built-in video camera app almost certainly offers a similar set of basic video editing features. Almost all major editors work as described above: Select video, click the editing option, slide from end to finish, and then save the video. The following three apps offer additional video editing capabilities, although each requires a one-time fee or subscription if you want to edit without advertising or limited features. YouTube - Video editor and video maker, No Watermark includes trim, cut, and split features, among many other options. Pruning: Lets you set up and finish the footage in the video, just like you can in Google Photos. Cut: Lets you select sections at the beginning and end of the video, and omit the section (i.e. cut) in the middle of your video. If you prefer a more full-fledged editing capability on devices, consider either a Kinemaster-Video Editor (for Android or iOS) or Adobe Premiere Rush-Video Editor (for Android, iOS, Windows, or macOS). Kinemaster not only allows basic edits, but also adds features such as multiple layers of video, sound editing features, and access to a variety of assets (such as music, graphics, fonts, and more). A subscription (\$5.49 per month or \$32.99 per year) removes the watermark and opens access to tools and assets. Adobe Premiere Rush supports multi-layered drag editing with access to templates, fonts, motion graphics, and more. Your work is synchronized between systems so you can switch devices and continue your work. Adobe offers a variety of plans, including a free start plan (limited to 3 exports), a subscription to a single app (\$9.99 per month) or an all-Apps Creative Cloud subscription (\$52.99 per month). In most cases, Google Photos works well when you want to crop a video, while YouTube costs money when you want an easy way to make more complex edits.
