It is available for multiple platforms and without downloading if you play in your browser. Name and graphic style aside, this is not a game for all ages. Parental guidance is recommended. Some game modes will require you to play a particular character. But even those that give you the freedom to choose a character are limited by the small selection available. There are only six characters, and not all of them are available for each map. You play the character you type when you select a level, and earn points to unblock sections containing other characters. While playing, the controls learn quickly. They're not complicated, but they're a little fintic. Fortunately, there aren't too many situations that require you to know any advanced controls or drives. Just take a figure and get there. While the controls are easy to learn, mastering them won't be that easy. A tougher selection of levels requires determining the accuracy on landing, and a steady pace when jumping over the map. Lack of accuracy causes hilarious fails that will take you as you prepare for the next run. Humor really stands out in this title. The game is free to download and play on your mobile device, giving everyone the opportunity to experience it. To support the cost of the game, advertising is supported.
