I have been using goPro Smart Remote (official GoPro accessory) for a few months. There are numerous situations where I find myself achieving for it. I had the opportunity to check out a few remotes and feel pretty confident about writing a buying guide for them. Here are the things I'll cover: Why you might want to goPro remoteGoPro remote recommendations charging your remoteSmart remote vs. smartphone appGoPro voice control - an alternative to buying remote situations that require GoPro to remotely ride my bike: My GoPro is mounted on my helmet and remote control installed on the handlebars. Best GoPro Smart Remote In 2020 If you're looking for the best GoPro remote, I've got you covered. Aside from GoPro's own offers, I have also had Check and test a few unofficial remotes that are popular on the market. Here are my most recommended GoPro remotes, ranked in order: Best overall: GoPro Smart Max Remote. Range: 600 feet (180 m) Waterproof: 33 feet (10 m) Compatibility: HERO5/6/7/8 Black, HERO5 session, Fusion, Max 360 Check price on Amazon GoPro Smart Remote is the official remote goPro accessory. It succeeds an old remote control called a GoPro Wi-Fi remote control. As an official GoPro accessory, it costs little more than an unofficial remote control. A natural advantage of this is the best compatibility with existing and future GoPro models. It is also manufactured with high GoPro standards, which means it is indeed waterproof to 33ft (10m) and runs on a 600ft (180m) range in optimal conditions. As you'd expect, you can turn goPro on and off and press the record button to start recording remotely. This allows you to add HiLight tags to mark key points and the LCD display lets you know things like the battery life and how long you've been recording. One of the key features of Smart Remote is the ability to change settings with a remote control. Third-party options and even the previous GoPro Wi-Fi remote do not allow you to change your settings with a remote control. While I don't find myself using this button much, it's definitely a neat addition. The box includes a key log and a wrist. The wrist strap can be adjusted to attach to all types of gears. When cycling, I personally use this steering clip, which makes for an elegant gear setup. Best unofficial: Suptig waterproof wireless remote control Max. Range: 160 feet (50 m) Waterproof: 6.5 feet (2 m) Compatibility: HERO5/6/7/8 Black, HERO4/5 Session, HERO3/3/4 Check price on Amazon This GoPro remote from Suptig is a good choice if you want to save money and don't mind going on an informal route. The design is very similar to the first-generation GoPro Wi-Fi remote control. It doesn't have a button setting like the second generation GoPro smart remote (see above), but it has all the other features including an LCD screen that displays key information. This is definitely not the flashiest third-party GoPro remote you can buy. However, the big plus in my book is the fact it has the same montage clip as the official remote control. Most third-party options lack it, meaning you are limited by using a wrist strap or general Cradle. Overall, he gets the job done and the fact he uses the same montage clip as the official accessory is a big plus. However, I'd still choose a GoPro Smart Remote if you can afford it. It has excellent durability, waterproofing, WiFi range and gives you the ability to change settings. Best for night use: TELESIN Smart WiFi remote control Max. Range: 160 feet (50 m) Waterproof: 6.5 feet (2 m) Compatibility: HERO 5/6/7/8 Black, HERO 4, Session 4/5 Check price on Amazon Amazon was close to making a decent alternative to the official smart remote control. At first glance, it looks just as good, while the cost is less. This allows you to change settings with a dedicated settings button. It even includes a programmable button that the official Smart Remote doesn't have. However, it has let down two things: First, despite being IP67 waterproof, it fails to deal with water contact well at all. I found my let water after dunking it into the sink, spoiling the OLED screen. Even if you don't take it underwater, it doesn't have the mounting clip that the official remote control and Suptig remote control has. Given how important the installation options are for GoPro users, this is a big drawback. It has one redemption function, however. This is its OLED screen that is clearly visible at night. Compare that to LCD displays on other remotes that need external lighting. That being said, how often do goPro movie movie owners have a movie video at night? Best with monitor: Removu R1 Max. Range: N/A Waterproof: 3 feet (1 m) Compatibility: HERO 3/3/4/5/6 Black, HERO4 Sessions Check price on Amazon Removu have created some amazing GoPro accessories in the past. One example is the Removu S1 carb I previously reviewed. The Removu R1 is a GoPro remote control that is also equipped with a live monitor. This means you don't have to return to the GoPro screen to get a preview in live back mode. Just look at the R1's 2.0-inch color LCD display instead. As neat as the R1, it's just not a good purchase anymore. Costing over \$200, it's just too expensive for what it is. In addition, HERO6 is the latest generation of GoPros it supports. At this point, we can only hope someone develops a remote control and control combo for the new GoPros. Worthy mention: GoPro Wi-Fi Remote Control (Stop) Max. Range: 600ft (180m) Waterproof: 10ft (3m) Compatibility: HERO 4/5/6/7 Black, HERO 4 Silver, HERO 3, HERO Sessions Check price on Amazon Prior to the release of GoPro Smart Remote, it was the official remote control. Although it doesn't officially list support hero7/8 Black, you can make it work with them. To this day it still has a better WiFi range (600ft/180m) and waterproofing (10ft/3m) than most unofficial remotes. It also has a montage clip that makes it better to join different things. However, I wouldn't recommend buying this now if you find it for dirt cheaply. It has 40% less battery life than the new smart remote control and doesn't set up settings or HiLight key moments. Not recommended: GoPro REMO Voice Activated Remote Max. Range: 33 feet (10 m) Waterproof: 16ft (5m) Compatibility: HERO5/6/7 Black, HERO5 session, Fusion Check price on Amazon GoPro Remo is proof that not every official accessory is great. In fact, it's a wearable wireless microphone that lets you use GoPro voice commands for remote control Gopro. It only works with GoPros, which already have voice control (starting with HERO5). It also finished compatibility with HERO7 Black and will not work with HERO8 Black. So why would you want to do that? Well, you can put it closer to your mouth so it raises your voice in a windy or noisy environment. But it still feels pretty redundant. In addition, its 33ft (10m) range is far less impressive than other remotes. It also doesn't have the LCD display status that every remote control should have in my opinion. Charging GoPro Remote all goPro remotes communicate using a WiFi signal. This uses energy and it means that you have to recharge them using the supplied USB cable from time to time. If you're using the official GoPro Smart Remote or Suptig remote control, you might want to consider getting this triple charger. This charger has two charging ports for Removable Lithium-Ion GoPro batteries. The third port allows you to dock the entire remote control (through a charging/mounting clip placed on a smart remote control and a Suptig remote control). GoPro Smart Remote Vs GoPro App If you have a GoPro, chances are you've already downloaded the Android or iOS GoPro app. It also allows you to remotely control a GoPro. Each remote control method has its advantages. Smart remote control is best for: Range. The smart remote has a typical WiFi range of 200-600 feet. The GoPro app has a range of 35-50 feet. Usability. Wearing gloves? Hands on the steering wheel? Using a smartphone app is almost impossible and you are much better off with a smart remote control. Severe conditions. The smart remote is much more durable as well as waterproof. Control multiple cameras. I haven't tested it myself, but the smart remote allows you to simultaneously control up to 50 GoPros! The GoPro app is best for: Live preview. The phone screen becomes a viewfinder and you can view and frame your pictures. Changing settings. Changing settings from an app is much more intuitive than doing it with a smart remote control. Price. The app is free! Another alternative: Use GoPro voice control If your GoPro has voice control (most of the new do), you can control it remotely by talking to one of the voice commands. I sometimes use voice commands, but there are some questions worth noting: don't always reliably pick your voice. Very limited range, even if you're screaming. You don't know if you started recording if you look at your goPro light status. Not for situations where you don't want to disturb your surroundings. Final thoughts I hope you enjoyed reading through my recommendations for GoPro remotes. While expensive, the official GoPro smart remote control is definitely my recommendation. Its native compatibility, clip mounting and superb WiFi range and waterproofing make it worth the extra money. If you're not quite ready to spend so much on Try goPro or voice control.
