Lady macbeth sleepwalking scene essay

Macbeth's top-rated free essay sleepwalking scene is extremely significant and important for the game as a whole. It contrasts with other major scenes featuring Lady Macbeth and marks the end of Macbeth's reign as a tyrant and king. In the sleepwalking scene we haven't seen Lady Macbeth for some time, and she's no longer the character we once knew. We get an idea of her state of mind, her thoughts and her feelings, and how she has changed so dramatically. In Act 5 of Scene 1 we can also see how some recurring themes in the play are still there, Darkness, Blood and Sleep. In the sleepwalking scene, Lady Macbeth is shown to lose her mind and her power over reality. She's sleepwalking because of stress, guilt and disturbed rest, there's almost an overload of thoughts in her mind, and he can't distance herself from the murders Macbeth committed and she's been involved in. Despite what she did, we can say that she only called Macbeth to murder because of her love for him. Although she encouraged the king's murder, she was not involved in the killings of Banquo or Lady Macduff. Lady Macbeth eventually goes crazy because her mind gradually disintegrates throughout the play. In the beginning she was strong and ruthless, though she could not kill Duncan because he resembled her sleeping father. Although we saw a glimmer of humanity when she said it, she was still the one who encouraged Macbeth when he began to wane: Art you afeard to be the same in fine self-activity and valor as you art in desire? (Act 1, Scene 7). It also helped calm Macbeth and reassure him when he did the deed, a little water clears us of this act, but in Act 5 of Scene 1 this reassuring comment comes back to haunt her, all the spirits of Arabia will not sweeten this little hand. As the game goes on she changes from this strong and ruthless woman into a woman who can't cope with the evil she's associated with. Duncan's murder created outrage in nature, and things have changed since then. In her dream, she talks about everything that happened, thus showing her involvement, Lady Macbeth is to blame for where she is now, and deserves a disturbed sleep because she helped kill the dream when Duncan was killed. She was never, naturally, a villain-like queen, she needed alcohol to make her brave enough to take part in Duncan's murder, Lady Macbeth was the one who came up with the plans, but she encouraged Macbeth to do so because she could never follow him through herself. She created a tyrant in her ambitious husband, and would have done even if the witches were not involved. It seems that Lady Macbeth was defending herself against the Dark Spirits, which she once asked to help her. She wanted them to remove her feminine instincts, but in the sleepwalking scene she is more vulnerable than she ever was. The image of Blood is often mentioned in Macbeth and represents treason, murder and death. In Act 2 of Scene 1 Macbeth sees a floating dagger leading him into Duncan's room and sees on the blade and dudgeon gouts of blood that tells us that the dagger was used to kill someone. In the sleepwalking scene there are constant references to the cases that Lady Macbeth and Macbeth have committed, so there are also references to blood. When Lady Macbeth seems to wash her hands, she says: From the cursed place, I say! This is in reference to the blood she had to wash out of her hands when she smeared it on servants. She also refers to Duncan's murder and blood, saying: However, who would have thought the old man had so much blood in it. Man cannot survive without sleep and, as Lady Macbeth and Macbeth show us, their minds are never at rest, and eventually they both perish. Macbeth is said to have killed the dream when he killed Duncan so that neither he nor his wife could sleep anymore. It is because of this slain dream that Lady Macbeth is sleepwalking. As long as she sleepwalks she goes through all the horrible things that have taken place, all the murders of innocent people. It is clear to us that the relationship between Macbeth and his wife quickly deteriorated after Duncan's death. He stopped trusting his wife because he no longer needed her support or her. This showed that he was quite capable of committing murder and was much stronger and more ruthless than Lady Macbeth, who could not cope with the guilt. At the beginning and even at the banquet scene Lady Macbeth was in complete control and could take care of her husband, but that was because she was in it in her about how far his ambitions took him. In Lady Macbeth's closing speech she asks for her husband's hands, and together in their deception with bloodied hands they go to sleep, but they can't sleep again. Everything that happened in Macbeth is accomplished Macbeth deeply, she was not a villain-like queen, as Malcolm called her, because a villain like the queen would be better able to cope with lies and guilt. Lady Macbeth was a man like everyone else, and she said: What is done cannot be undone by showing us that although she did what she did, she cannot change it, even if she regrets it all. This scene gathered the central themes of the play in the character's final revelation, where we see the impact these themes had on Lady Macbeth's character. (1.7.29). Then, to keep Macbeth committed to the murder plan, she verbally attacks his courage and masculinity. She accuses him of being the kind of person who can only dream of wearing royal clothes when he's drunk. She asks sarcastically: Was hope drunk / What did you dress'd yourself? Hath has he slept since then? Macbeth tries to defend himself by saying: I dare to do anything that can become human; / Who dares to do no more (1.7.46-47), but Lady Macbeth declares that she is more of a person than him: I have given a suck, and know. (1.7.54-59) After that, it's really all over. Lady Macbeth wins. Macbeth asks what happens if they fail and his wife ... Wife...
