What is dry ice? Gordon Chen/Eyeem/Getty Images Dry ice is just cooled and condensed with carbon dioxide. It skips the melting process and sublimates directly into the carbon dioxide gas when it reaches room temperature and pressure and expands. It is very cold and hovers around -109.3 degrees Fahrenheit. When it is not used to cloud rock concerts, it is often used to keep perishables cool during delivery. (Thomas Slate was the first to sell it to cars in 1924.) It has a number of other fascinating uses, too. For example, it is used to clean up the New York subway system from rats. Try attaching it to the bottom of the RC car for some seriously pleased Fast and Furious effects. It is abundant naturally on a number of celestial bodies in our solar system including Mars and the moons of Uranus and Neptune. Five years ago NASA's Mars Orbiter Express noticed an avalanche of dry ice collapsing Martian slopes. Bought in a store dry ice can be expensive and hard to find. It's also way more fun to do something from scratch (at your own risk, of course). Fortunately, the popular mechanics you have covered with a super simple recipe for creating creepy pairs yourself. So how can I do that? Well, it's actually quite simple and you can make it be something you probably already have in your home. Ingredients: Heavy gloves Carbon dioxide fire extinguisher (should be labeled CO2)Cloth bagInstructions:△ Because the dry ice is so cold you can get frostbite. Make sure these heavy gloves are up to tobacco. Nozzle your Co2 fire extinguisher into a cloth bag, sealing it tightly. Shoot away! (Or, depending on the type type open the valve.) Close the nozzle or fire extinguisher valve. Shake this bag like it's a polaroid picture. Remove the newly formed dry ice from the bag and enjoy. If you want to keep it cool for longer, slam it into a Styrofoam cooler, and make sure to leave the lid slightly ajar. But... Isn't dry ice dangerous? peepo/Getty Images It Can Be! Remember that things are very, very cold. Prolonged exposure to dry ice can actually freeze your skin cells and leave you with an injury similar to a burn. If you're plopping it into a fancy drink, be careful not to swallow it. And make sure you dispose of it properly so don't drop it in the sink or throw it in the bin. To speed up sublimation, you can pour hot water into any container you store it in. Also, make sure you use it in a ventilated room. Breathing too much carbon dioxide can be fatal, especially for children, Fido, and fluffy. Finally, laying dry ice in an airtight container (including a freezer) creates pressure and can cause the container to explode. Please make a dry ice bomb for a reason.
