

Download and install the app, then connect your phone to your computer to transfer files. Grab this package [htc_ime.zip](#) from DroidDeveloper.com, un-zip two files in this package and then place them on your phone's SD card by turning on the USB Mount from drop-off notifications on your phone and opening a removable drive that should pop up on your system. Turn off your phone by throwing it on both computer software and turning off THE USB storage in the phone's notification area. Finally, lift the app window from the bottom of the home screen, start the eoeAppInstaller app, and it should search your phone's SD card and report all the .apk files it finds there. Click and hold the file HTC_IME.apk and select Set. Approve all the pop-up problems about the entrance collection and the like, and you have a new keyboard installed. How do you use it? Go to your phone settings menu, select Locale and Text, then turn off your Android keyboard and turn on Touch Input and tap the Touch Input settings menu to set automatic and spelling options for portrait and landscape modes. If you only want to sometimes try the Touch Input soft keyboard, you can keep both the Android and Touch Input keyboards on, and then click and hold on to any typing box to select the keyboard.
