You've added comments to the sheet and now you want to print it out with these comments intact. However, Excel does not print the default comments. Here are two ways to do it. ANSWER: Add comments to formulas and cells in Excel 2013 Before you print comments on a sheet, you should be sure that the comments are not hidden with these instructions. As soon as your comments are shown on the sheet, click on the Page Layout tab. Click the Dialogue Button Installing page sheet in the bottom right corner of the Options section of the Layout Page Page. The Leaf tab in the Dialog Box Setting the page is automatically displayed. To print comments on a sheet, select an option from the Comments list in the Print section. To print comments at the end of a sheet on a separate piece of paper, select the option at the end of the sheet. Comments are not related to cells, but a link to the cell and the name of the person who wrote the comment are included in the comment. To print out comments as they appear on the screen, select how the list is displayed. This option preserves any formatting applied to comments when printing them, such as bold, stressed, foundry and colors. Click the Good button to accept the changes and close the dialog window. The next time you print this sheet, any comments you show on the screen will be printed in the chosen format. If you want to change the way you print comments on the Print screen behind the scenes, right before you print the sheet, click on the Page Settings link. When you open the Page Settings dialog, you automatically see the Page tab from that location. So you'll have to click on the Leaf tab on the Page Setup dialog box to get access to it. Then change the Comment settings and click Good. The option you choose in the Comments list applies to each sheet in your work book separately, meaning that if you turn it on for one sheet, it will not be included for other sheets in the workbook. So before you choose the option in the Comments list, make sure that the sheet containing the comments you want to print is an active sheet. If you're editing multiple sheets in Microsoft Excel, it might be helpful to group them together. This allows you to make changes to the same range of cells in multiple sheets. Here's how to do it. Grouping multiple sheets in Microsoft Excel Grouping sheets together in Excel can be useful if you have an Excel work book with multiple sheets that contain different data but follow the same layout. The example below shows this in action. Our Excel workbook, called School Data, contains several sheets related to the school's operation. Three sheets have student lists for different Class A, Class B and Class C. If we put these sheets together, any actions we perform on any of these sheets will be applied to all of them. For example, let's say we want to insert the IF formula into the G4 (G4 to G12) column on each sheet to determine whether students were born in 1998 or 1999. If we group the sheets together before inserting the formula, we can apply it to the same cell range on all three sheets. Simply click and hold Ctrl, and then select the sheets you want to remove from the group. The tabs of the sheet that you ungroup will return to the gray background. A range is a group or block of cells in a sheet that are selected or highlighted. In addition, the range may be a group or block of cell links that came in as an argument for the feature used to create the graph or used for these bookmarks. An adjacent range of cells is a group of dedicated cells that are adjacent to each other, such as the C1 to C5 range shown in the image above. The non-contiguous range consists of two or more separate blocks of cells. These blocks can be separated by rows or columns, as shown in the A1 to A5 and C1 to C5 bands. Both adjacent and non-adjacent ranges can include hundreds or even thousands of cells and flying sheets and The ranges are so important in Excel and Google tables that names can be given to certain ranges to make them easier and reused when referenced in charts and formulas. When cells have been selected, they are surrounded by a contour or boundary. By default, this circuit or boundary surrounds only one cell in a sheet at a time, which is known as an active cell. Changes in the sheet, such as editing or formatting data, affect the active cell. When you select a range of multiple cells, changes in the sheet, with a few exceptions, such as data entry and editing, affect all cells in the selected range. To create a range consisting of adjacent cells, drag with your mouse or use a combination of Shift and four arrow keys on the keyboard. Use a mouse and keyboard or just a keyboard to create ranges that are not adjacent to cells. When you enter a number of cell links as an argument for a function or when creating a chart, in addition to entering the range manually, the range can also be selected by pointing. The ranges are identified by cell references or cell addresses in the upper left and lower right corners of the range. These two references are separated by the colon.
