Voter turnout was recorded at 62.82%, 4.65% less than in the previous Assembly elections in Delhi, but 2.2% more than in India's general elections in 2019. The term of office of the Assembly, elected in 2015, expired on 22 February 2020. Aam Aadmi's party, led by Arvind Kejriwal, won 62 seats to win an absolute majority in the elections. Previous Elections to the Assembly were held in February 2015. After the elections, Aam Aadmi's party formed a state government, with Arvind Kejriwal becoming chief minister. The election schedule was announced by the Electoral Commission of India on January 6, 2020 at 15:35 Moscow time.
