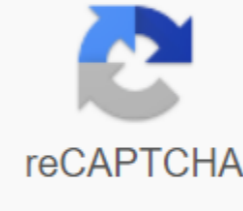

## Cell organelles crossword puzzle answer key

Ready to dive? Read on for the top 10 crossword-solving tips. Page 2 Crossword puzzles are a bit like a spider web; each response is associated with others nearby to form a woven network of letters. Tugging on one string of letters affects everyone else, too. Most crossword puzzles are naturally divided into several groups of up and down clues, associated with other groups with longer responses. With that in mind, working through the puzzle one group of columns at a time -- as opposed to going through all the tracks at once, followed by all the clues -- is a good strategy. Every word you fill out will help solve the others around it. The clue will always be written in the same part of the speech as the answer. Check for clues that call for answers ending in S, ED, EST, or ING. Often these endings can be charted (but not always). Checking the crossword puzzles of these responses can help check if the ending applies. For example, if both over and down is a plural trail for two responses that exceed the last letter, chances are that it is the letter S. Foreign words will be directly marked, Friend: Fr. = AMI or indirectly, Friend, in France. Abbreviated responses are directly indicated, Whistlestop (Abbr.) = STA or indirectly with a abbreviated word as part of the clue, RR stop = STA. These conventions are an accepted norm for American-style puzzles. Do you know the names of the elements in their symbols? Todd Helmenstine Crossword puzzles are not only fun, but can be a good way to practice spelling unknown words, such as the name of elements on the periodic table.
