On a cold January morning in 1912, about 25,000 textile workers in Lawrence, Massachusetts, got up from their looms, left the mill and went on strike, which eventually became in the history books. Workers, mostly immigrant women from about 45 countries, sought not only higher wages and better working conditions, but also the higher rewards of their adopted country: art, dignity and beauty. We want bread, their cry is hungry, and so are the roses. Nine decades later, that feeling echoed again through American garment factories and homeless shelters thanks to an ambitious photography project called Invisible America. For the past two years, the International Union of Service Workers, one of the country's largest trade unions, has equipped migrant workers, Filipino nannies and asbestos removal crews with 35 mm cameras and asked them to document their lives. Most people in this society feel invisible, says Esther Cohen, founder and executive director of Bread and Roses, SEIU's nonprofit cultural arm Local 1199.Cohen hopes to change that - with 100 donated cameras, footage of professional photographers who are willing to teach classes for free, and, she says, the only working people's art gallery in the country. Cohen believes that being noticed is a prelude to being heard. When we did this project with building maintenance workers and mounted exhibits in the buildings where they worked, the repairmen took on a different identity, she says. They became human because they took pictures. But the project is not only about art, but also about politics. I think it's expected that working people don't have much to do with a great culture. That's not right. Working people have deep, amazing things to say and interesting ways to tell them, says Cohen, whose 26-year-old organization also conducts creative workshops for union members and organizes theater troupes to perform during the lunch break of hospital workers. To date, about 1,500 people, from doormen in Manhattan to steelworkers in Indiana, have taken photos of the courses and displayed their work. Alicia Truss, 42, lives in a small room in Holland House, once a famous Manhattan welfare hotel that now provides supportive accommodation for men and women with a history of homelessness, mental illness or When Truss participated in the Unseen America project in late 2001, she took dozens of photographs, several appeared in an exhibition called No Place as Home at the local 1199 Martin Luther King Gallery. One of the most compelling photos of the trail, which she called Spectacular Chance, shows a small store in The Port Authority of Manhattan that sells lottery tickets. Huge neon letters above the store roar the word Lotto, creating an alarming double effect of lighting and distortion. The potential sea of wealth deep inside the shabby transit station resembles an oasis and a mirage. Some people walk by and think they're going to win the lottery one day - that it's their turn, that they have a chance, Truss said of his photo. But others think they will never win. Do you think he'll read the instructions next time? Banana Boat Sport Performance may be warning about avoiding use near fire, but the man now wants the products to carry a stronger warning of the once unseen danger. As if it would help: A study published last year in the Journal of the American Dietetic Association found that only one-third of people who say they always read food labels actually do. Imagine how this number translates to security instructions. Staying safe with products is partly the job of the manufacturer and part of your job, said Patty Davis, a spokeswoman for the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). So here are three other ways to avoid ruining barbecues this summer. Grill Now you know to remember about applying sunscreen near the grill, but that doesn't mean it can't flare up for other reasons. An estimated 3,800 gas or charcoal grill-related injuries were treated in emergency departments in 2010, the CPSC reports, mostly due to burns but some cases of carbon monoxide poisoning. Pro tip: Before you light the grill, remove the grill and thermal diffuser that sits below, it's probably baked into a carbonated cannon. Most outbreaks come from fat, fat and meat gathering there. If you keep this clean, it should solve 90 percent of the flash problems, says David Joachim, author of Fire It Up. Then, every time you grill, heat it for 15 minutes and use a hard wire brush to clean it. Right before you toss the meat, the coat is grating with a packet of paper towel slightly dipped in rapeseed (Looking for a great recipe for your next barbecue? More than 246,000 people were injured in Gutter's emergency departments or stool-related injuries in 2010, the CPSC reports, so get the leaves out of the gutters the right way. Mark Clement, host of MyFixItUpLife, a home improvement radio talk show, attributes most of these injuries to hitting power lines or falling down stairs due to incorrect positioning. It's an easy fix: With your sliding-resistant extension of the ladder positioned on a sturdy, flat surface, make sure the rails are straight up and down. You know you have a ladder at the optimal angle to work when you have your fingers touching the feet of the ladder, you reach out with your hands straight and you touch the stairs rails with your fingertips, says Clement. As you work, keep your body centered on the rails to avoid tilting and toppling. (Avoid these 7 common pitfalls on your next DIY project.) In 2010, the CPSC estimated more than 89,000 people visited emergency departments after using a walk-over or riding mower. Most visits have been treated and relieved, but leg amputations were not uncommon when the leg came into contact with the rotating blade. Save your feet with a mower that acts like your car: When you want to change your legs backwards, stop and move the lever to make it happen, says Clement. This type of poetry can often be lyrical in nature, for example, when the character in the play gives a dramatic monologue. Dramatic monologues are a very common form of dramatic poetry. In a dramatic monologue, the speaker addresses an imaginary listener, so they do not speak directly to the reader. This type of poetry is well suited to dramatic context, because characters in a theatrical production can often have small speeches where they appeal to an imaginary listener, and in many cases, the audience fills that role. This type of poetry can have a song as a quality to it, using lyrical elements or even using a more narrative structure. Thus, the dramatic monologue and dramatic poetry in general are not limited to its associations with drama and theatre. Instead, dramatic poetry appears in numerous different contexts, using a multitude of poetic devices and variations in the context of a dramatic environment. Some classic examples of dramatic monologues, notably My Last Duchess Robert Browning, A Love Song by J. J. T.S. Eliot and Murder Floor Ai. Some examples of dramatic poetry may be after hearing The Waltz of Bartock By Amy Lowell, Battle of the Bards by Theochtist, Servant Servants by Robert Frost or Lady and artist Robert Browning. Examples of symbolism in poetry include a rainbow as a symbol of hope and good vidons, a moon used to represent isolation and fatigue, and a river as a symbol of lost memories. Symbolism in poetry is often used to strengthen the poet's words. Symbolism is a

type of literary device and may not always be evident at the first reading of a poem. Specific nouns and verbs can be used to represent traits, concepts, and aspects. Another example of symbolism is the phrase new dawn. This phrase not only symbolizes a new day, but also symbolizes the opportunity to start over. Other literary devices include allegory, alliteration, antithesis, anastro and analogy. Literary devices can be either literary techniques or literary elements. Literary elements are used as a way of interpretation and analysis, such as setting, plot and subject matter, while literary methods are used as a way to express artistic meaning through language, as when hyperbole or metaphor is used. Depending on the specific interpretation, literary methods and elements can sometimes be used interchangeably. Knowledge of various literary devices helps the reader understand what a writer or poet is trying to say.
