More than 20 years before the Golden Trio Apparated in Our Hearts Forever, Mark Hamill, Carrie Fisher, and Harrison Ford schwummed and bench-pewed their way into the becoming a cultural phenomenon. Generations have been left to use this appeal in other media entertainment, and - for those still trying - I have 20 books Star Wars fans will love. Once upon a time, the franchise now owned by Disney, was Star Wars Advanced Universe (EU). Comics, novels, video games, you name it: if it was 1) was Star Wars and 2) wasn't a movie, it was part of the EU. And while the EU gave us some really impressive moments and characters, it got more than a little messy. Because the last thing you want is a controversial canon, Disney has decided that only some EU material will be accepted in the new Star Wars canon, and has made everything else apocryphal. Today, when people sit down to create new Star Wars material, they can use or ignore everything they find in the EU. So if they want to make the Nomi Sunrider canon again - and fulfill my desires to nerd a little heart - they can! If they want to take her name and turn her into a blue Twi'lek with a third eye, they can! Disney's move is all pretty brilliant, in fact, because it has turned the EU into a treasure trove of Star Wars myths and legends. Now a brief note on how this list was put together. If you Star Wars die hard, who owns every book - eu and New Canon - and reads science fiction almost exclusively, I'm sorry. This list is not for you and you probably won't find any new book recommendations here. However, if you're a Star Wars fan who's not familiar with the extra-movie media franchise, and hasn't read much science fiction, classic or modern, congratulations! You'll probably find a lot of interesting things here, and it excites me. This list of books for Star Wars fans contains only four Star Wars novels: two from the EU, and two from the new canon. Image: Lucasfilm Google Books Project, a six-year-old task of digitizing as many books in the world as possible, is an incredibly difficult and ambitious undertaking. Working alongside disparate library systems, governments, private collections, universities and more has proved to be a challenge that has met all kinds of resistance. This is not even taking into account some of the most basic obstacles Google has had to deal with. One of these major obstacles is at the heart of the entire project. If you're going to digitize the book world, it makes sense to figure out how many books there really are, but as it turns out, the whole can be a nuisance in itself. Google put up a blog post today that illustrates how difficult it was answer to such a simple question and it's strangely fascinating. First of all, what defines the book? Number of individual editions separate books, right? How different do the two editions have to be to count the two books? What about compilations of existing works? You can't even rely on established systems such as ISBN: ISBN is a fairly recent system that was widespread only in the 1970s, and it is clearly more accurate when documenting books from the Western world. Each individual standard classification has its own problems, and seemingly absolute data, such as the author and the title, are actually very vague and therefore not particularly useful. The way Google has decided to deal with this problem is by collecting metadata and swelling as many duplicates as possible. Each name is called a cluster that includes all sorts of editions and forms of one work or volume. This results in the counting of 210 million clusters, but these clusters, in turn, must be cleared of non-bronze materials, catalogued, in particular, by the Library of Congress. These non-books include microforms, film, maps and, oddly enough, about a thousand T-shirts. Google then eliminates TV series, many of which are often given for one job, confusing the graph. So how many books are there? Says Google: Once we exclude TV series, we can finally count all the books in the world. There are 129,864,880. At least until Sunday. Now, just sit back and wait for that question to be asked on Jeopardy!
