Breakthrough Suicide Squad star Harley Quinn (Margot Robbie) is released from Jared Leto's Big Bad Joker, and returns to the big screen in his own superhero adventure, Birds of Prey, in theaters on February 7, 2020. The foolish foray into the DC Comics extended universe boasts a modern soundtrack and star-studded cast on Robbie's flank, including Jurnee Smollett-Bell, Mary Elizabeth Winstead, Rosie Perez, Ewan McGregor, Chris Messina, and newcomer Ella Jay Basco. In her review, Mashable's Angie Khan praised Robbie's brilliant performance, which cuts through the gloom like a neon sign in a dark alley and adds more depth and shading to Harley's quinn. However, Khan explained that the film's sequence was a bit subpar-like while jumping a strange tempo, making the narrative unnecessarily confusing at the beginning of the happening, and the brutality and humor didn't always sit well together. Sometimes it's hard to know what to do with what we see on the screen... That's what critics say about birds of prey (and the fabulous emancipation of one Harley Quinn). Meg Downey, Gamespot: One notable sticking point is Birds of Prey encounters a bad feeling of walking. Harley's non-linear narrative is funny, of course, and while it works in the context of her character, it can get hard to keep track of what happens when. The problem becomes more apparent as several plot streams begin to weave into one. At worst, the cut and paste style feels like fun, but ultimately an unnecessary time sink that stands in the way of teams coming together... Laura Prudhomme, IGN: The plot winds down, skids, and doubles back on itself... overly complicating a fairly simple story in which different factions are on the hunt for a stolen diamond ... or hunting for those who prey on him. Thankfully, Ian's stylish direction and keen sense of comedic time keep things alive, even as the story begins to strain under the weight of so many competing storylines. John DeFore, The Hollywood Reporter: Christina Hodson's screenplay indulges in a couple of epic memories as he lays this premise, sometimes breaking a chronological impulse without any clear purpose. Sean Keane, CNET: However, Birds of Prey is more about its characters and mood than its plot - Harley's narrative jumps between different within a few days during which the story takes place, making the first half of the movie a little more chaotic than it should be. The Birds of Prey (The Huntsman, Black Canary, and Detective Rene Montoya) deserves more screen time from Owen Gleiberman, Variety: Actresses who came together to form Harley's squad as Jurnee Smollett-Bell as Roman's nightclub chanteuse Black Canary or Ella Jay Basco as the wily Cassandra, have a spare presence, but you want to be more of a spare. , the creation of her antagonists, and the creation of other women crammed into that very long title, and unfortunately, birds of prey are the ones that get shortchanged on the ambitious scale of this tale ... Sean Keane, CNET: Huntress is a little under-represented in terms of character development - it feels like a character whose story plays its own film - but Winstead will make you forget that with her exceptional comic timing. Each of the ensemble brings its own energy to the group and the tension between them is fun, but it is overcome too easily before the climax. Laura Prudom, IGN: Fighting scenes in Birds of Prey are terrific and more than earn an R-rated movie - using all sorts of props (from baseball bats to bags of cocaine), a satisfyingly squelchy editing sound, and a deranged sense of humor to create something really exciting. And, thanks to an emphasis on practical tricks and well-choreographed camera movements, smackdowns have a palpable, bone-crunching quality that sets them apart from the overly CGIed slugfests found in many other superhero movies recently. It works silently in the background, offers a great set of powerful features, and, best of all, worked very well in my tests. This should have an anti-theft program to install on your computer - a great alternative or addition to using other laptop tracking and recovery apps. In other words, almost everyone could use Prey. Installing an open source program on my laptop works quickly and easily. Using the default settings, I signed up for a Preyproject.com control panel account where I could manage the program's settings and access detailed reports as soon as I reported my laptop missing. Unlike other tracking and recovery apps, Prey doesn't communicate with the central remote server until you want to. This feature plus the transparency of an open source program adds important privacy guarantees - you may not want any third party to track your computer's location unless there's a good reason to do so. I tested the system by noting my laptop was missing from the dashboard. After that, it seemed nothing was really going on on my laptop - an important feature, in fact, so the thieves probably didn't know their movements were being watched. From installation to tracking activation, Prey is silently running in the background and using minimal resources. 15 minutes later, however (I changed the amount of time to check the default updates for 20 minutes for every 5 minutes), I was notified by email of the new Prey report. On the Prey control panel, the report provided me with a deleted IP address of my laptop (my INTERNET ISP's IP), an internal IP address, a MAC computer address, an accurate Google map of my location, a screenshot of my desktop as I wrote this article, and an eerie webcam photo of myself. In short, the program worked, and if my laptop was actually stolen, this information could be useful to local law enforcement to get my device. One thing I didn't test, for obvious reasons, was an expanded program module to lock your computer, hide Outlook and Thunderbird email profiles, and delete browser cookies and stored passwords. Passwords. Not as protective as the ability of other programs to remotely erase all data from your computer, these locking features can help protect at least some of your sensitive information. Aside from the idea that a report should be created as soon as the laptop is flagged missing (rather than wait by default 20 minutes later), the only other problem I have with Prey is that although I couldn't find the program in the list of running services, the app did appear on the program list and could easily be uninstalled from there. Thus, a tech-savvy thief (or at least someone who has heard of Prey) can simply search for it and remove the app from the program menu. Paid tracking and recovery programs can offer more robust features such as built-in BIOS to prevent a detour if a thief reformat your computer and work on your behalf with law enforcement to get the device. Prey, however, is a completely free program that offers many of the important features you want in tracking and restoring your application: stealth, small footprint, and reliable reporting. Since it can be installed side by side with other similar programs, Prey can also increase your chances of getting your laptop back even if you use a commercial app. For these reasons, I highly recommend Prey as part of basic mobile security measures for almost everyone.
