Six trim levels are available: S, SE, SEL, SEL R-Line, SEL Premium and SEL Premium R-Line. Each Tiguan is equipped with a 2.0-cylinder four-cylinder turbocharged engine that develops 184 horsepower and 221 pound-feet of torque. The Turbo-4 has an 8-speed automatic transmission. The front-wheel drive is standard, but all-wheel drive is an option. All Tiguans, with the exception of the basic Model S, have head-on collision warnings, automatic emergency braking, which includes pedestrian detection, and blind-zone monitors. These valuable safety features are available for the S trim, in a \$450 Driver Assistance Package. The SEL trim level adds adaptive cruise control. Active lane control, automatic high-beam headlights and parking sensors are included in the SEL Premium version. Crash testing by the Insurance Institute of Road Safety led to top good ratings in each category, but Headlights Performance denied it was a Top Safety Pick. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has not yet completed its safety check. The third row of seats is standard in front-wheel drive Tiguans and optional with all-wheel drive. Small seats are only for small passengers. Prices don't include a \$995 appointment charge. The 2019 VW Tiguan S (\$24,295 front-wheel drive, The \$25,595 all-wheel drive) includes ups ups and downs of fabric, a 6.5-inch infotainment touchscreen with Apple CarPlay and Android Auto compatibility, Bluetooth, cruise control, LED taillights, heated mirrors, automatic headlights and 17-inch alloy wheels. The front models have three-tier seats. The SE (\$26,695 with FWD, \$27,995 with 4Motion AWD) replaces the 8.0-inch touchscreen, and adds a non-smart ignition, two-zone automatic climate control, driver's seat, heated front seats and synthetic leather upholstery. Standard safety features include head-on collision warnings, automatic emergency braking with pedestrian detection, blind-zone monitors, and rear-traffic alerts. SEL (\$31,795 with FWD, \$33,095 with 4Motion AWD) adds navigation, digital instrumentation panoramic hatch, adaptive cruise control, parking sensors, 18-inch wheels and power lift. SEL R-Line (\$33,645 with FWD, \$34,945 with 4Motion AWD) adds black trim parts. During 2019 year, the production of regular SEL R-Line was superseded on the SEL R-Line Black Edition. The SEL R-Line Black (\$33,695 with FWD, \$34,995 with 4Motion AWD) comes with 19-inch black alloy wheels and black exterior trim. THE SEL Premium with 4Motion AWD (\$37,195) receives 19-inch wheels, power folding mirrors, a loud power lift, active lane control, a surround camera system, parking sensors, windshield wipers, Fender sound and leather upfit. The SEL Premium R-Line with 4Motion AWD (\$38,895) features similar to the SEL Premium above, but adds R-Line appearance features and 20-inch wheels. The Beijing Motor Show gave us the opportunity to see the face-raised version of the Volkswagen Tiguan. As shown above, Tiguan now wears the same corporate grille first seen at Last Golf and now makes its way to the rest of the lineup. A 2010 Tiguan is shown below for reference. Engine failure - 2010 Model Second Issue reported automotive complaints is engine failure, which affects the 2010 Tiguan most often. The average cost of fixing engine failure is \$3,900. The problem appears to appear most often about 96,000 miles away. The most common solutions for engine failure include: Replacing engineDecoking valves Replacing rear seal and VAVL PCVRReplacing circuit synchronizationTiming Chain Tensioner - the 2009 Model Third issue is the tension of the synchronization circuit, which seems to be a problem for the 2009 model. It usually costs about \$3,200 to fix and occurs about 89,000 miles away. The best way to solve this problem is to replace the engine or replace the synchronization chain tension. The overall Series of ReviewsA reviewers Edmunds address the overall quality of Tiguan in these reviews: This reviewer was surprised by Tiguan. They drove a variety of cars of the same class, including the Mazda CX-5, Jeep Cherokee, Toyota RAV4, Ford Escape and Chevy Equinox, none of which mattered the handling of the Volkswagen Tiguan. They paid \$24,300 for a well-designed 4Motion SE with a dark gray background and spoke wheel, which has an MSRP of \$29,215. The platinum color with an all-black interior is similar to the Audi. The features are intuitive in the SE package. It's fun to drive in the city and does well on the highway. They have acquired a five-seater and are happy with the expanse. Leg space and stock are optimal in the front and back of the vehicle. The sound and technical capabilities are great. Acceleration from a full stop is mediocre, but they found using engine torque from keeping the near/min low works better than punching the gas pedal. They found Eco Mode provides 2 mpg better than the stated dealer. After a full year of ownership, the car is still working optimally. Another reviewer argues that the car will not accelerate properly from the start. This appears to be due to a delay in the supply of gas to the engine, combustion problems, or possibly a disconnected shift. They found it intimidating to merge into not knowing how well the car will accelerate. Despite the comfort, visual appeal, options and price, the lack of acceleration performance was too problematic. Most offensively, VW VW aware of this problem and won't do anything to fix it because its software doesn't see any problems. Another reviewer noted the constant creaking from the passenger's side dashboard area. Finally, this reviewer was pleased with the throttle reaction. He was taller than the 2018 model, who felt she didn't have enough energy. Sports mode is not needed to achieve the necessary throttle reaction. This reviewer doesn't usually use an included navigation system, but this particular system is well designed and intuitive with a head-up display. The sound quality can be improved, says this Edmunds reviewer, but it works well for the family SUV. The few usb ports available in the first and second rows are great, as are the 12-volt port presented in each. They use a Bluetooth connection and Apple CarPlay are interchangeable, and both systems work well. Fuel and Engine Concerns We found that these Edmunds reviews focus on fuel and engine power. This reviewer found fuel economy to be much better than the EPA advertised. They get 26.9 mpg with combined city and highway driving. They don't use the start/stop function. This reviewer recommends that the drainage pipe hatch be checked for damage because their faulty design causes a leak. Online forums show that many owners are facing this particular problem. A couple of years ago, a class action lawsuit was filed against VW. This reviewer had several problems with their Tiguan, including repairs to injector seals, T8 fuel injector use, airbox engine, braking line, and consumption of a variety of pads. They were dealing with an additional electrical problem before an engine problem in which they were stopped by the police for their headlights not working. They replaced the headlights twice. They are currently experiencing a strong smell of gasoline both inside and outside the vehicle, making them feel very unsafe. The spark plug of this reviewer burst into the engine that destroyed their 2016 Tiguan engine. The center accused the owner of using the aftermarket for a fork. While the 2009 Volkswagen Tiguan has amassed the most complaints, the 2011 model is considered the worst due to the high repair cost and low mileage on which most issues occur. Engine failure is the most common problem reported The 2010 Tiguan.Volkswagen improved the look and performance of the 2010 Tiguan in later models, but did nothing for the most reported problems: engine problems.
