The trail is mainly used for hiking. Dogs are also able to use this trail, but must be kept on the leash. There's a \$5 parking fee. Marys Peak, at 4,097 feet, is the highest point on the Oregon Coast and the most prominent peak west of Corvallis. On a clear day, from the top of the peak, you can see both the Pacific Ocean to the west and many of the cascading peaks to the east through the Willamette Valley. Wildflower exhibits in the meadow and rocky gardens change over the final months of spring and summer. The rich meadows of Mary's Peak are bordered by a single forest of noble fir trees. Great walk.
