After the early years of success at that time in the Vietnam War in the air, Navy Colonel Frank Olt had submitted a detailed report documenting all aspects of the Navy's air-to-air combat performance from 1965-1968. The most important aspect of the report was the need to improve tactical wars within the pilot fleet. One finding of the report is the formation of an elite new program to train the world's top fighter pilots to train respected base pilots. The program was Top Gun. Originally formed in 1969, TOPGUN was a small experimental program formed at The Miramar Naval Base in San Diego, which stands in the middle of the Vietnam conflict. The original class of nine graduates would eventually grow over the next few years, and positive results were immediately seen in the Vietnam War with an increase going from 2 MiG kills to 12 MiG kills on all U.S. planes and 12 MiG killings on all U.S. planes. Although the popularity and appeal of the fighter pilot lifestyle can be attributed to depictions on the big screen. The TOPGUN program currently remains and is one of the most successful programs established for fighter pilot training. Now located in the Nevada desert at Naval Base Fallon, TOPGUN still attracts 1% of the world's elite pilots and spends more than 100 hours in the classroom honing its skills. Anyone who wants to be a naval officer (and perhaps someday a ship captain) has several options. The U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland, is a four-year undergraduate college where graduates are preparing to work as navy officers. This is an authoritative and challenging program that congressional nominations must apply. Potential officers may also attend an officer candidate school in Pensacola, Florida. This 13-week course is stricter than boot camp, where recruits must hold a degree before accepting. After completing initial training, recruits can attend technical school or participate in the Jerniman program. This allows each navy to recruit skilled sailors of different classes to learn a variety of naval challenges first-person. Navy Reserve Navy Reservists train one weekend each month and two weeks each year. They provide the reserved strength of trained sailors that can be called in if the Navy requires additional personnel for a specific reason. Reserve members are eligible for technical training during their service, and may benefit from certain veterans when they retire. Coastal life for naval personnel is almost identical to other military bases. Everyone earns a housing salary (new employees typically live in dormitory-style apartments), and basic housing is available for single sailors and larger families. Many amenities are included in the base, such as grocery stores, medical facilities, churches and libraries. Recreational opportunities include a cinema, golf course and fitness center. Of course, the focus of naval life is to live and work on ships. Standard naval ship deployment lasts six months. However, the Navy has been experimenting with deployments for more than six months to be more flexible and predictable. Needless For more than a few months with hundreds on the ship, it means a close section and a lot of patience and friendship. The situation also requires full and unwavering loyalty and obedience to a captain who has absolute authority over his ship. There is a great deal of work to be done at any given time on navy ships, so sailors will remain busy. Nevertheless, limited recreational activities are offered - one famous example was the Reagan Idol singing contest held on the USS Ronald Reagan, which landed the winner on the real-life American Idol TV show in 2007. In addition, all sailors receive 30 days of leave each year. They can fly for free on an atmospheric basis on navy flights and most other military flights [source: U.S. Navy]. Idol Talent Contest on March 26, 2006. Women play an important role in the modern Navy, a wage that reflects progress toward equal treatment and the Equal Rights Movement in the United States. In 1976, Congress ordered that women be allowed to enter the Naval Academy. But a 1948 law prevented women from serving on most Navy ships. This was overturned in 1978, and the women have been serving in their home countries aboard naval vessels ever since. In addition, women were cleared for air combat duties in the 1990s, and now serve in that regard as well [Source: PBS]. As a member of a U.S. military organization, all naval personnel are subject to the uniform norms of military justice. Navy's dismissal can take many forms, from honorable discharge to court martial, depending on the circumstances surrounding the dismissal. See how the Army works. Navy veterans and retirees are eligible for benefits ranging from state cemetery burials, health and life insurance, mortgages or low-interest loans for small businesses, and veterans' health care.
