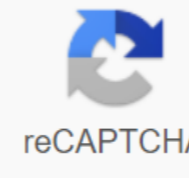

Texas private applicator license pre test

STEPS TO BECOME A PRIVATE PESTICIDE APPLICATOR Step 1: Complete a private pesticide applicator training session. Contact your Texas A&M AgriLife Extension county office for information about training opportunities. o You can purchase training materials from some county extension offices, by post in the form of an order (PA-1405) at www.aes.tamu.edu, or call (979) 845-1099, and we can order by phone with a master card or visa. o You can get a private pesticide applicator training session from a county extension agent, or you can get online training for \$75 by registering here. Step 2: Upon completion of the training, the candidate will be provided with a training verification form (D-1411) (a form provided by the county extension agent or trainer). o Applicants should keep a yellow copy in their dossier. o A white copy (original) should be sent to the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) using the Private Pesticide Applicator (PA-400P) license application form. Step 3: The applicant must obtain a printout of the private pesticide applicator (PA-400P) license application form from the TDA or by clicking the link. (Website: www.TexasAgriculture.gov or telephone: 1-800-835-5832 or 512-463-7622). Step 4: Submit a completed application form for a private pesticide applicator (PA-400P), a \$100 license fee, and a white (original) copy of the training verification form (D-1411) to the TDA for processing. Step 5: After accepting the license application, TDA will send the applicant a letter by mail with the account number. This account number is the number that the applicator will use to register and schedule a private applicator exam with PSI Step 6: Candidates can go to PSIexams.com or call 1-800-733-9267 to schedule an exam at one of the 22 locations across the state. PSI employees are not allowed to provide advice or licensing information. o The PSI website contains a newsletter for candidates applying for a pesticide licence to assist the applicant in the process of planning exams. o A private applicator will pay \$64 for an exam. o There is a 24-hour waiting period for a repeat exam. o PSI will provide confirmation number and test location information. Step 7: Upon completion of the exam, the test centre will immediately provide test results. The rating of the repealed is 70% or more. Step 8: PSI sends exam results to the TDA every day. Texas Private Applicator Training - Online Course Pest management is a technical pursuit. Requires control of insects and other vertebrate pests and undesirable plants. This requires education, training and experience to ensure this control in an efficient, economical and environmentally safe manner. In Texas, licensing and certification requires education and training to do this work. A pest management specialist or specialist must also pass an exam(s) administered by the Texas Department of Agriculture. Private pesticide applicators shall be licensed and certified for the use of pesticides restricted to the use and use of pesticides to a limited extent by the State for the production of agricultural goods on properties which they personally own or lease. Commercial and non-commercial applicators use pesticides for different pests in many different places. Examples of licensing categories available in the TDA include vegetation management, field pest control, nursery plant production, public health pest control, pasture and field pest control, and seed treatment. Structural pesticide applicators apply pesticides to urban areas, residences, commercial and industrial properties, schools and other environments where people work, live and play. Certification for structural applicators is done through the Structural Pest Control Service, a division of the Texas Department of Agriculture. The Agricultural and Environmental Safety Unit at Texas A&M AgriLife Extension provides written research materials as well as education and training for pesticide applicators in Texas.
