Myanmar is the country with the highest proportion of the population, giving money to charity (85 per cent). In general, the country ranked third in the list of the most generous countries. Turkmens (57 per cent) were the most willing to volunteer. While the whole world has become a more generous place in all three giving behaviors, the driver has been the increasing number of people wanting to help a stranger, according to the survey. Another 200 million people said they helped a stranger in 2012, more than double the rise of those who donate time or money to charity. Men are more likely to help a stranger than women who are more likely to give money to charity. After the United States, Canada became the most generous country as a whole in 2012.
