

While he responded directly to the principles of good practice for English proficiency for international students at Australian universities (2009), the model required changes in academic language and learning (ALL) practices that were controversial with staff and students, including the introduction of a new English assessment after entry, and the change of all work within the English language. Six months after the model was implemented, minor changes were required, as many staff resisted the introduction of the model as originally intended. This paper reports on studies conducted over a one-year model to understand whether the concept model of English language proficiency was subsequently understood and to what extent conceptualized the English language model and whether its appropriate reconceptualization of ALL practices was subsequently understood and put into practice by staff and students. The mixed-use approach has been used drawing primarily on transcripts of staff interviews, triangulated, where possible with feedback from survey students, and all teams of individual job records of consultations.
