## Steamer trunk coffee table pottery barn

What I love most about high-quality furniture is its staying power. During his decades-long career at home, a well-made piece can serve many purposes. After all, a bedside cupboard is a bedside cupboard only when you put it by the bedside. Choose a different location for the same piece, accessorize it accordingly, and the same small table can easily perform a completely different function. As your life and needs change, the quality of your furniture adapts. Since the fall, our lift-top table with Sauder sits in the living room where he does these table things he does best- displaying books and magazines, for example, and keeping drinks at hand. As the countertop floats, the piece also served as a casual work surface and even functioned as an improvised snack bar. Recently I have been thinking about even more ways to take advantage of the versatility of the table. I mean, what if I didn't use it as a coffee table? The same features that make it work so well in the living room — built-in and low profile — would allow it to work just as well elsewhere in the house. ENTRYWAYI love my house, but it's not perfect. Especially in the colder months, I am annoyed by the lack of a coat cabinet in the entrance. Especially now that the holidays bring guests, and these guests bring parks, peacoats and puffer jackets, I knew that something needed to be done to stop the impending onsoument of winter accessories. Back, we have a mudroom that goes a long way toward keeping our kids things organized. I thought if it works for kids, it can work for everyone. So I decided to recreate the magic of the mudguard in the hallway. The recipe for success included three key ingredients: a place to hang coats; a place to store various items, such as hats and gloves; and an area for people to sit down while you take off your big, bulky shoes. Coffee table, with all things, binds all these requirements together. While in the living room we used a table of cubbies to store board games and DVDs, here the same cubbies hold winter boots, lunch boxes, and a basket to catch wayward gloves. With the addition of a clothes hanger and umbrella container, our winter wear solution has become complete. To make the area as attractive as it is industrious, a small graphic carpet warms up the space, and cozy pillows and a throwing blanket invite visitors to rest upon arrival or when they are preparing to leave. All told, it only took me 15 minutes to move and restyle the coffee table, and I feel confident that in a new location, it will serve us well throughout the season. WINDOW SEATMy kids learn to read, and it's great to see them so excited about books. To encourage their new entertainment, I wanted to create a special place where they can comfortably with your favorite book. A A sitting in the playroom would be ideal, because the exposition looks at the garden and has a beautiful view of the sunset. We may be a year or two away from building this window seat, but in the meantime, I couldn't help testing the design concept. The coffee table serves as both a bench and a mini library. A well-made piece of solid wood furniture, it is durable enough to hold the weight of a 40-pound baby. And integrated cubbies fit books of all sizes, keeping them off the floor in a room whose carpet often can't be seen on blanket emigration. At the top of the table I placed a long, comfortable pillow covered with fabric that combines the love of my girls to both the rainbow and the animals. A few chy throw pillows complete the look. The beanbag chair, which we already had at hand, sits next to the bench, so both girls can occupy the nook at the same time if they want. Sure, soon my youngest one planted herself on the window seat to browse through her latest library find. I would not like to have a table in our living room, where it fits the décor and our lifestyle. But I love to know that if peace ever evolves to the point that the table no longer belongs, I can easily use it elsewhere. Larger sculptural succulents, such as pencil cacti or branches such as eucalyptus or cherry blossoms, have a great time to anchor larger coffee tables. Courtesy of Stefanie Stein Round coffee tables can be a little tricky. In general, they look best when the items are arranged in a triangular shape: a pile of books, a tray and a bowl, for example. Too many square or rectangular items can also make the round surface feel a little off. Playing with different geometric shapes, from circles to hexagons, will help the surface feel more dynamic. Courtesy of Liljencrantz Design On square coffee tables, try to divide the area into quadrants and display the layout of four main items: a stack of books, a tall plant, a tray or a collection of bowls, for example. Vases, candlesticks or souvenirs give your surface a more dynamic and interesting character. It will also create a height where things can feel a little flat. This may include remote controls, boxes of matches for candles, coasters or other small items you want to have at hand on your coffee table, but it may feel out of place or not have enough weight on your own. This can be especially influential if you have a bold or colorful coffee table or if your books are color-coded or have a specific theme. Typically, stacks of two to four books work best. While we tend to save these types of objects to racks or console tables, interesting objects can have a greater impact on the coffee table where people gather, so don't be afraid to throw in some unexpected items, especially those with interesting stories.
