In T1DM, basal insulin in combination with fast-acting insulin when eating provides a close but imperfect substitute for the production of endogenous physiological insulin. T2DM is characterized by insulin resistance and progressive beta-cell dysfunction. Obesity is added to the inherent resistance to insulin in T2DM and can be an independent cause of insulin resistance in T1DM.
