University of Minnesota-Morris As the most affordable school in this ranking of sociological programs, UM Morris already has a clear advantage in attracting entrants. But the mind's strong emphasis on research makes it the best choice for any student, regardless of budgetary problems. The most striking example of this attention is the Morris Academic Partnership program, which gives exceptional students the opportunity to conduct research in accordance with teacher counseling (and through scholarship). In addition, the school encourages sociology to participate in conferences, contribute to faculty work and even conduct its own research first-hand. Few other universities have such a scientific-friendly environment for sociology - especially not at the incredibly affordable price of UM Morris. Net price: \$13,352/year of Haverford College tuition, how to do sociology is the goal of Haverford College's best student sociological program - an approach that distinguishes the school from others that focus more on theory than practice. Haverford's well-developed program also includes a number of interdisciplinary concentrations, including peace, justice and human rights and Middle East and Islamic studies. In addition to courses in Haverford, sociology majors have access to classes in Bryn-Moore, Swarthmore, and the University of Pennsylvania and can earn a course loan from these institutions (with the permission of the department). The depth of Haverford's offerings, plus its relationship with other well-known schools, make it a great option for those who want to explore more esoteric fields of sociology. Net price: \$21,056/yr Vassar College Location Poughkeepsie, NY Those interested in crossing culture and the environment will appreciate Vassar's geography anthropology interdisciplinary core. This unique program combines two social sciences to provide perspective on both, and a degree unlike any other on this list of available small colleges for anthropology and archaeology. Vassar encourages students who choose this option to continue either fieldwork or study overseas experience, and this facilitates the first through the Field World Bureau, which helps place students in loan positions during the summer. These opportunities are usually centered in Poughkeepsie and Mid-Hudson Valley and include organizations such as the Dutchess County Historical Society. Net price: \$21,265/yr Swarthmore College Swarthmore combines its affordable Anthropology Baccalaureate program with the sociology department, giving students the opportunity to jump between two areas and a plethora of courses that each major offers. In addition to the dozens of classes that fall into one area or another, Swarthmore provides a set of courses that cross both, like Race, Gender, and the environment and Dancing Desire in Bollywood Movies. In addition, both sociology and professors teach intro-level courses, which means that incoming freshmen will have the privilege of learning from experts in various fields. Net price: \$21,580/year of Hamilton College Hamilton College is a liberal arts institution that has its roots in the 18th century. Throughout his rich history, Hamilton has supported traditional, humanities-oriented scientists who give students considerable freedom to indulge their rarities. The school's open curriculum system allows each student to work closely with the faculty counselor and build a set of classes that are in his or her best interests. This freedom - which allows you to explore anthropology, archaeology and sociology topics within one degree - is a big part of what makes Hamilton one of the best small colleges for sociology and anthropology specialties in the country. Students also benefit from the Hamilton Senior program, in which they conduct research on the topic of their choice, in accordance with the advice of two departmental faculties. Net price: \$21,907/year Wesleyan University is the largest school in this ranking of sociological programs, and as such this Connecticut institution offers an incredibly wide range of options. Anthropology Major, for example, gives students the opportunity to conduct one of ten separate concentrations in subject areas as specific as the Production and Consumption of Culture and Incarnation and Biopolitics. Major Archaeology is also diverse, with four separate tracks that provide incredibly deep immersion in specific subject areas. For example, the track History of Art covers everything from the archaeology of food to the art of Anglo-Saxon England. Wesleyan's many specialization options and attractive prices make it one of the best small colleges for anthropology and archaeology in the country. Net price: The \$22,257/year Millsaps College of Archaeology program in Millsaps is one of the best in the country, which is particularly impressively superb given the relatively small school size. The department is particularly known for its work in the ancient Mayan city of Kiuch, where Millsaps students helped make discoveries that led to a radical rethink of previous ideas about Mayan history (not to mention a National Geographic documentary). This best small college of anthropology and archaeology strikes well above its weight, giving its students unique opportunities to explore some of the hottest digs in the world. Net price: \$22,512/yr Augustana College No School on this ranking of sociological programs is more focused on the topic of ethnic and cultural tolerance than the August College, which is home to the designated Center for the Study of Pluralism. Augustana Sociology, Anthropology and Social Security runs this unique facility that brings famous speakers to campus, supports student and provides a supportive workspace for researchers by exploring these topics. The Augustana Sociology Catalog also provides a variety of courses in addition to the Center covering topics such as immigration, American race and ethnic relations, as well as gender relations. Net price: \$22,715/year Bowdoin College of seafood lovers and outdoor enthusiasts will find a happy home at Bowdoin College, which is located in Braunschweig, Maine and provides exciting opportunities for student studies in surrounding areas. Past specialties in anthropology have studied the traditional state boating community, the North Maine potato industry and harriet Beecher Stowe's house (which Bowdoin actually owns). But this best small college of anthropology and archaeology is also working with other departments to allow students to get a broader perspective. For example, the African Studies Department offers courses on African-American experience such as race, biology, anthropology, race and ethnicity. Net price: \$23,156/year North Central College for those who can't choose between sociology and anthropology, North Central College in Naperville, Illinois offers a double major that covers both areas. The Affordable Sociology Baccalaureate program also includes several optional concentrations (in criminal justice, public studies and general sociology), while basic anthropology puts a strong emphasis on studying abroad. Students pursuing the latter degree can also dig into a number of subdisciplines like archaeology or language and linguistics, and the Chicago Field Museum is a common choice of internship. One of the unusual features of North Central College is its trimester schedule, which includes three 10-week terms. Net price: \$23,565/yr Barnard College Barnard has the distinct advantage of a close relationship with Columbia University, one of the most prestigious educational institutions in the country. Barnard's archaeology and anthropology departments are certainly the beneficiaries of this collaboration, with many faculties sharing responsibilities between these two outstanding schools. But Barnard's connection to Columbia is not the only factor that makes it one of the best small colleges of anthropology and archaeology. The school also offers a set of grants to support research and field work, many opportunities to study abroad, and some particularly unusual courses (including Magic and Magic and Pirates, Boys and Capitalism). While few are as interesting as Miley Cyrus's Sociology: Race, Class, Gender and Media (from the 2014 course catalog), the school continues to pique the interests of students with new classes like race and power, quantification of women, and sociology of folklore. Net price: \$24,038/yr Trinity University Trinity leads a list of nearly 100 opportunities to study abroad, many of which are the perfect complement to the higher undergraduate sociology program. Sociologists can visit Senegal for the Language and Culture programme; Vietnam for a cultural education program, social change and development; or a number of other sites in India, Japan, Denmark, Turkey and many other countries. Trinity is urging its sociology majors to seize the opportunity to explore other countries - or simply get a change of scenery - and even facilitates internal experience at other colleges in the US. Like many schools on this list, Trinity sees studying abroad as a vital element of sociological education - but Trinity is doing more than most to support this endeavor. Net price: The \$26,165/year Pitzer College Pitzer Affordable Anthropology Baccalaureate program includes two separate but intertwined tracks - a more theoretical social and cultural concentration of anthropology, as well as a more field-based biological anthropology and archaeology focus. While many of the best small colleges for anthropology and archaeology offer both programs, Pitzer is quite unusual in supporting another school - nearby Scripps College - in creating its degree. The Pitzer-Scripps Anthropology Program provides an opportunity to continue either sociocultural or human evolution, backstory and material track culture, or combine both for a particularly rigorous academic program. The latter option also allows students to build a one-to-one course their specific interests in each area. Net price: \$26,288/yr Connecticut College While many schools think internships are only just For career-focused programs like Business, Connecticut College asks for different. In fact, CC makes on-job tuition available to students of all specialties - and even provides \$3,000 scholarships to help with internship costs. This level of support is one of the main attractions for anthropological students who can apply for international internships in Argentina, Ghana, Switzerland and many other countries. In addition to the top anthropology program of the bachelor's degree, CC also boasts a strong set of interdisciplinary certificates, including one available through the Center for Comparative Study of Race and Ethnicity. With a certificate, both sociology and anthropology can expand their knowledge in various subject areas without adding years to their completion dates. Net price: \$27,417/year of Worcester College All Worcester students conduct an independent study of the project in high school, which the school sees as an integral part of its focus on undergraduate studies. Similarly, in some ways the dissertation allows students to dig into a particular area of interest and gain little experience at the graduate level. In the past, anthropology majors have used this time to explore topics such as college dating behavior, working mothers, and academic student records of athletes. Along with many of the school's other perks, this science-oriented approach to learning makes Worcester one of the best small colleges in sociology and anthropology specialties - especially those planning to get a master's or ph.D. degree. Those involved in the excavation will appreciate the department of classical and Middle Eastern archaeology, and students of sociology will be able to choose from a number of unusual programs (including interdisciplinary and the structures of major cities). Perhaps the best feature of Bryn Mora's approach is that the school encourages students to sample courses in other disciplines. tempting prospect, given the large number of programs on offer. One of the coolest features of the school is the simulated excavation field in Keka, which provides realistic simulations of excavations that include reconstructed ruins and even physical remains. This facility is unlike any other in the world and should make Dickinson the top pick for any student wanting to dig into archaeology.
