This doll hook blanket is designed to cover 18 dolls including American Girl dolls. It is a simple piece of crochet blanket that uses v-seams for details. Each row of this crochet blanket begins and ends with 3 double crochet stitches. Between them, you'll have V-stitches separated by double hook stitches. You'll always crochet V's in V's (work in chain space V below) and crochet the standalone double crochet stitches (which are between the V's) in double crochet stitches from the row below. The pattern begins and ends with a row of single crochet stitches to create a boundary for the blanket. Okay, now here's how to do it: Start the chain: Chain 70. Line 1: One crochet in the second circuit off the hook, single crochet in each chain across. (Total 69 single crochet) Line 2: Chain 3 (considered as the first double crochet), double crochet in each of the next two single crochet, - skip the next one crochet, skip the next one crochet in the next one crochet, repeat from th to 14 times, skip the next one crochet, V-stitch, skip the next one crochet, double crochet in the last 3 single crochet. Line 3: Chain 3 (considered 1st double crochet), double crochet in the next 2 double crochet, V-stitch in chain 1 space, double crochet in the next double crochet, repeat from th to y 14 times, V-stitch in chain 1 space, double crochet in the last 3 double crochet. Lines 4 - 36: Repeat line 3. Line 37: Chain 1, sc in the first 4 dc, s in chain 1 space, sc in the next 3 dc, repeat from th to th through the range, sc in the last dc. End, leaving the length of the yarn about 6 inches long. Weave at the ends using a large eye yarn needle. This crochet pattern is designed as a doll's blanket. However, it is a stunning square crochet pattern that can also be used for various other projects. In its current size, this crochet pattern also works as: Placemat/setSquare dishtowel table; You can also make smaller lines (less repeat line 3) for a rectangular dishtowelA crochet hood pattern; Make two of them, place back to back, team up on both sides of the seamsA crochet scarf pattern; Make three or four of them (depending on the length that you want) and combine them together vertically with a large square blanket; Make nine of them and team up (3x3) for a large crochet blanket. This one For crochet, where V-seams border on one crochet, it's a stunning design that's easy even for beginner artisans, so it's good to keep in your library when you want to create something based on the area. You can make this square smaller or bigger by changing your choice of hook and yarn. Dealing with easy light and a steel hook for crochet for small projects. Work it out with bulky yarns and a size K or bigger hook to do something much bigger. Play with all options. This is a versatile square crochet pattern that works for many other things than just a beautiful doll crochet blanket that does so well. Recommended yarn for this project Bernat Softee baby yarn. Weight light is the worst, DK, or Double knitting. This is important to know in case you want to choose another yarn to replace; Look for the same weight if you aim to create a blanket with the same drapery. However, you can use any weight of the yarn and the appropriate size of the hook to create a light blanket for crochet baby using this pattern. This crochet blanket sample includes instructions for three sizes: preemie, newborn and toddler. The instructions list the smallest size first with changes for larger sizes marked in brackets. The measurements below do not include edging; If you want to add a baby blanket edging, your finished blanket will be a little bigger. Premie: The smallest blanket measures about 26 inches wide at 34 inches long. If you hook a blanket using Bernat Softee, you'll need two to three 5-ounce skeins yarns to complete this project, depending on how tightly you hook. As far as yards goes, you need about 724 yards/662 meters for the blanket itself, and a little more for your swatch sensor. Newborn/receiving blanket: Medium-sized blanket 30 inches square. You can do this a little longer if you prefer a more rectangular shape for the blanket. If so, the target is for 30 x 34. You will need two to three of the 5-ounce Bernat Softee balls for this size, depending on how tightly you crochet. Toddler: The largest of the blankets measures 36 inches by 44 inches. You will need four 5-ounce balls of Bernat Softee hook of this size. ch - chainch-1 sp - chain-1 space. space formed when you crochet chain stitch in the previous rowp - repeats - repeatscine - one crochet and stitch sensor stitch: 4 stitches and 1 inch with a crochet stitch pattern as indicated below. Line Sensor: The string sensor is not important to this pattern. To check the sensor, hook the swatch sensor. Form a starting chain of 25 stitches and hook, using instructions on the blanket pattern until your piece is square. The end. Measure your swatch to see how many stitches per inch you crochet. Compare the sensor with the one recommended in the template (see above). If you crochet fewer stitches per inch than recommended, try again with a smaller hook hook. If you hook more stitches per inch, try again with a big hook. The swatching process is essential because you want your baby blanket to be Size. If your sensor is different, your baby blanket may end in the wrong size or you can run out of yarn before finishing the blanket. Teh Teh Directions instruct you to hook in ch-1 space. If you're having trouble finding these - sometimes they seem to disappear- carefully poke your finger in a series of stitches from back to front. Your hands will feel the tear even if your eyes didn't notice it in the first place. Ch 105 (121, 145). Remember that the instructions are for small sizes (with medium, large in brackets). Place the marker stitch in the first ch off your hook. Sc's 3 p.m. off the hook. Chh 1, skip the next hour, sk in the next ch. Rep all over the series. ch 1, turn. Sk in the next ch-1 sp, ch 1. Rep sequence in brackets throughout the rest of the line. At the end of the line, the work is sc st in st where you placed the marker; You can remove the marker before the stitch works. ch 1, turn. The rest of the strings are exactly the same as line 2, with one minor difference: at the end of the line, work your last sc st into the pivotal chain of the previous row. Rep this row until the baby blanket reaches the desired length. Molly Johanson When you need to change to a new ball of yarn, use the same technique as you would to change color. When the baby blanket lengths what you want, cut out the yarn, leaving at least six inches of extra yarn. Thread the needle tapestry with the yarn end and use the needle to weave the loose end of the yarn into the blanket. Repeat with any other loose ends you may be hanging from the blanket (which occur when moving from one ball of yarn to another). This crochet pattern works great without any extra edging, but you can add edging if you want. There are plenty of baby blanket edgings to choose from. A simple single crochet stitch around the edge of the blanket is an easy choice that goes well with the single crochet design in this pattern. 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
